


NO SOCIAL DISTANCING **REQUIRED**

Lido Isle residents appreciate the usefulness of a good bridge in going about their day-to-day business. But when Lido Isle opened to the public in the summer of 1928, there was no bridge. Lido Isle's opening day in that year was bustling with people from all over southern California, but they were all brought in by boat. The attached photograph shows what a logistic challenge this was on that very busy day. Lido's developers realized that they needed to quickly remedy this situation if they planned to sell any real estate, and they built a temporary causeway giving access to the island. There are no photographs of the causeway that have come to Old Isle's attention, but contemporary advertisements make clear such a structure was in place. Finally a permanent bridge was built (and has been rebuilt in identical form in recent years), and a panoramic and early view of Lido's essential lifeline to the mainland shows how far Lido has come in the past 90-plus years.

I'm writing this column at noon on Friday, May I. Outside, I hear siren blasts and a clear, loud voice announcing that Newport Beach is testing its new Outdoor Warning Notification System.

We now have two new emergency notification systems: one local and one state-wide.

Newport Beach's **Outdoor Warning Notification System** is an upgraded version of the city's Tsunami warning sirens. The new system includes three strategically-installed speakers for broadcasting notification sirens and voice commands with preliminary information and instructions. The speakers are located at West Jetty View Park/Wedge, Marina Park on Balboa Boulevard, and West Newport Park, near 60th Street & Seashore Drive.

The speaker notification system will be used for all hazards or disasters where immediate action from the public is necessary. They will be tested each month on the first Friday at noon. If you hear the speaker notification system, and it's NOT the first Friday of the month, turn on your television to channel 3 or radio to 107.9 **KWVE** for further instructions and information.

At the state level, California now has an earthquake early warning Smartphone app called MyShake. MyShake will give Californians who download it, warnings from any corner of the state.

Alerts on the MyShake app will be sent messages to areas expected to experience a shaking intensity of level 3 or above. (Level 3 is defined as "Felt quite noticeably by persons indoors, especially on upper floors of buildings. Many people do not recognize it as an earthquake. Standing motor cars may rock slightly. Vibrations similar to the passing of a truck.")

Warnings will also be sent by text message (similar to Amber Alerts) through the Wireless Emergency Alerts system. However, you should download the MyShake app if you can. Text alerts will be sent to people in places where the minimum intensity level will be somewhat higher, starting at 4. (Shaking level 4 is described as "Felt indoors by many, outdoors by few during the day. At night, some awakened. Dishes, windows, doors disturbed; walls make cracking sound. Sensation like heavy truck striking building. Standing motor cars rocked noticeably.") Those text message alerts will also be slower than the app because the system was designed for other types of emergencies where mere seconds don't make a big difference.

What can you do with a few seconds of warning?

- o You can drop, cover and hold on.
- o Crews can shut down fuel pipelines pumping at high pressure.
- o Surgeons can remove their scalpels and shut off electric cauterizers to prevent fires.
- o Transit agencies could slow trains to reduce the chances of derailment.
- o Fire stations could make sure garage doors are open so firefighters can quickly get to emergencies.
- o Elevators could stop at the closest floor and open to let passengers out.

How reliable is the MyShake app? For now, we can expect false alarms and missed alerts. However, the consensus in countries like Japan and Mexico that have similar systems is that the potential life-saving benefit is worth any deficiencies.




LIWC's Spirit is Alive and Well

She spent 8 years racing in the junior program at LIYC where she reached the level of sabot A. In addition to high school practices and regattas throughout the year, she races in CFJ's for LIYC. Lauren has accumulated 3 years of coaching experience to date working mostly with the Novice class. She is eager to get back on the water and share her love of sailing and the Lido program with the kids!



Michael Gaffney is a Junior skipper on the Newport Harbor High School Varsity Sailing Team. Throughout this past season, he was able to sail at a few major high school regattas including Rose Bowl, Golden Bear, and Gaucho. Newport Beach Police Advisory:

An Open Garage = An Opportunity for Crime

In the last several weeks, we have seen an increase in garage burglaries reported. Many of these cases are related to garage doors being left unsecured. An unattended, open garage leaves all of the property in the garage visible & easily accessible to passersby. Even if you just step away from your garage for a moment, burglars can easily grab a bike, tools, golf clubs or other valuables and disappear in just a few seconds. With these things in mind, please remember to keep your garage doors (including pedestrian doors) closed & secured when you are not present.

Here are some additional tips for preventing garage burglaries:

- If your garage door has a "remote lock" button on your wall pad, use it nightly or when you are away. This will disable any garage remote, including the one in your vehicle.
- If you cannot disable your remote, consider removing the garage door opener from your vehicle as it can be used to open your garage & possibly enter your home.
- Lock bikes and other valuables to something stationary within the garage.
- Consider improving the lighting on your property, criminals like to work in the dark.
- Use a padlock in the garage door's track 1/4 inch above the roller when the door is in a closed position. This will prevent the door from opening in the event someone has a garage door opener with your door's frequency.
- Cover your garage windows with curtains or blinds to prevent burglar from seeing what you keep in your garage.
- Put your Neighborhood Watch to work. Make a strong commitment to knowing and watching out for each other.




