However, their all night barking, ability to sink your boat and dock and take over in vast numbers is an issue in our bay. According to the City of Newport Beach website, the problem areas are the H & J fields and South Lido. Many of us can attest to experiencing first hand these issues.

WHAT SHOULD YOU DO TO DETER SEA LIONS?

Sea lions like to make themselves at home aboard vessels and docks in the harbor. However, there are rules in place that require boat and dock owners to install deterrent measures to prevent sea lions from getting aboard.

All mooring and dock owners must frequently check to make sure their deterrent measures are in place, are effectively preventing sea lions from boarding and are kept in order at all times.

A message from Diane Dixon: **NEWPORT BEACH CITY COUNCIL**

Dear Neighbors,

Thank you to those that attended the August 13 Lido Isle Town Hall on airport issues. If you were unable to attend, know that your neighbors filled the meeting room and many relayed, strongly and clearly, their concerns about flight noise and pollution. I assure you the Lido Isle "voice" was heard.

The City of Newport Beach continues to work with a team of expert consultants and the airportfocused community groups on identifying the quietest, safest, cleanest departure procedure possible out of JWA. An essential aspect of this effort involves working collaboratively with the air carriers and they have all expressed their willingness to talk with us.

We've collected months of data, and are beginning our discussions with the air carriers, to determine if an existing departure procedure (how planes take off) can be slightly adjusted to further reduce noise impacts to our community. There's also the possibility that the collaborative effort will lead us to propose a completely new departure procedure, also with the goal of further reducing noise. I should note that changing a departure procedure altogether is a long and involved process, but if we believe that is the best option for our community, the City and its community partners will pursue it. I encourage you to visit the City's JWA webpages (www.cityofnewportbeach/jwa) for more details about our efforts and to learn about ways you can get involved.

In other City news, Grace Leung stepped into her new role as Newport Beach's city manager on September 4 and immediately hit the ground running. Grace has a strong financial and operations background, and is equally adept at directing large projects. I am enjoying working with Grace and look forward to seeing her influence help shape our important projects and issues. She has already expressed her desire to enhance, and in some cases, streamline, communication both internally and externally and welcomes all suggestions. And, she is continuing to write the Insider's Guide, which provides a brief overview of the upcoming City Council agenda and a few noteworthy items. Attention Lido Parents!

Nothing is more important than your child's well-being, especially when disaster strikes. Here's what you should do to prepare your home and family for a major earthquake:

Take a CPR and first aid class.

• Assemble a three-day supply of food, water, clothes, medical supplies and other necessary materials for everyone in your family. Include an extra pair of eyeglasses and house and car keys. Store all these in one place and make sure everyone knows where that is.

• Keep extra cash and change on hand. If electricity is out, ATMs will not be working.

• Decide where and when to reunite if your family is apart when an earthquake happens.

• Choose a person outside the immediate area to contact if family members are separated. Long distance phone service will probably be restored sooner than local service.

• Know the disaster response procedure at your children's school or daycare center. Make plans beforehand to have someone get them if you can't.

• Does your child know his or her complete name, address, medications, allergies and your contact information? If not, prepare an emergency card to keep with him/her at all times.

• Conduct Earthquake: Duck, Cover & Hold drills every six months with your family.

• It may be unsafe to move from one room to another during a quake so discuss the safest place in each room. Stay away from heavy furniture, appliances, large glass panes, shelves holding objects, and large decorative masonry such as fireplaces.

• Stay out of kitchens and garages. They tend to be the most dangerous places because of the items kept there.

• Keep your hallway uncluttered. A hallway can be one of the safest places during an earthquake.

• Establish all the possible ways to exit your house. Keep those areas clear.

• Locate the shutoff valves for water, gas and electricity. Learn how to shut off the valves but do not actually turn off the gas. If you have any questions, call your utility company.

• Make copies of vital records and take photos of your valuables. Store these electronically on a remotely-accessible server or place them in a safe deposit box in another city.





When exploring Lido Isle history, it is hard to ignore one of the most prominent past Lido Isle residents... Johnny Mercer. Mercer was an incredibly prolific songwriter and lyricist. His list of works includes songs performed by such luminaries as Duke Ellington, Ella Fitzgerald, Tony Bennett and Frank Sinatra (as well as Barry Manilow, who used many Mercer lyrics after Johnny died in 1976). Mercer songs include standards such as "Moon River", "Days of Wine and Roses", "Satin Doll", "Winter Wonderland" and almost countless other famous names.

Mercer moved his family to Lido in the 1950s so his kids could experience a more normal childhood, out of the Hollywood limelight. They lived at 108 Via Koron, pictured here circa 1955, a house that has remarkably stayed almost identical to its original and beautiful self. And the Mercers' great friends, the Ober family, lived around the corner at 328 Piazza Lido. You can read about some of their adventures online, in a book by Glen Eskew, Johnny Mercer, Southern Songwriter for the World. But better still, have a Mercer music night at your house to honor a true Lido luminary. You will find loads of options on Apple Music. There are many versions of Mercer songs sung by Mercer himself, which is a treat. Mercer's music is very listenable and a great accompaniment to a latesummer evening. And he even wrote some lyrics about Lido, which we will publish in a future column!

ork Loin Roast pound carrots, peeled and cut into 2-inch pieces I pound parsnips, peeled and cut into 2-inch pieces

Hutumn

2 medium-size sweet onions, guartered

3 teaspoons salt, divided

11/2 teaspoons freshly ground pepper, divided 1/3 cup olive oil, divided

3 tablespoons fresh rosemary leaves, divided

Kitchen string 2 tablespoons Dijon mustard 4 garlic cloves, coarsely chopped 6 large garlic bulbs 1/4 cup apple cider vinegar

1 (4-lb.) boneless pork loin roast

Preheat oven to 425°. Combine first 3 ingredients in a large bowl; sprinkle with 1 tsp. salt and 1/2 tsp. pepper. Sauté vegetables in 3 Tbsp. hot oil in a 7 1/2-qt. roasting pan over medium-high heat 8 minutes or until caramelized. Remove from heat, and stir in I Tbsp. rosemary. Tie pork with kitchen string, securing at I-inch intervals. Sprinkle pork with remaining 2 tsp. salt and 1 tsp. pepper, and place on top of vegetables in pan. Stir together mustard, chopped garlic, 2 Tbsp. olive oil, and remaining 2 Tbsp. rosemary; spread over pork. Cut off pointed ends of garlic bulbs. Drizzle with remaining 1 tsp. oil. Arrange garlic bulbs, cut sides down, around pork in pan.

Bake at 425° for I hour and IO minutes or until a meat thermometer inserted into thickest portion of pork registers 160°. Let stand 10 minutes.

Prep Time: 41 Mins Total Time: 2 Hours 24 Mins Yield: Makes 6 servings

Transfer pork and vegetables to a serving platter, reserving drippings in pan. Add apple cider vinegar to pan, and bring to a boil over medium-high heat; reduce heat to medium, and simmer, stirring often, 3 minutes or until thickened. Pour over vegetables. Slice pork, and serve with roasted vegetables, garlic bulbs, and Caramelized Apples.



Matt's Corner

BOAT GARDENS

With winter time quickly approaching, here are a few reminders for boat storage on Lido Isle.

Covers are required for all boats in the gardens. Please check your boats on a regular basis to ensure you are following the rules set forth by Directive II.

- I. All dry storage boats must be stored on a trailer, dolly or rack. The entire boat and dolly or trailer, including all protrusions, MUST fit within the assigned space.
- 2. Each Lessee will maintain their boat and trailer or dolly, if applicable, in a neat, well-maintained condition. Inspections of the boat and facility will be conducted periodically. After inspection, notice will be sent to Lessees whose boats, dollies or trailers need repairs, giving thirty (30) days to rectify the problem.
- 3. All dry boats must be protected by fitted covers in good repair secured to prevent the boats from filling with water or debris. Plastic covers, other than those fitted specifically for the boat, are not allowed. Sabots must be stored upside down when not being used on a regular basis.
- 4. Boats that are not actively used may not be stored in LICA facilities. LICA has the right to terminate the Lease Agreement per Sections 7 and 19 herein, if in the Board of Directors' reasonable determination a boat is not being actively used.

Thank you for your attention to these sensitive subjects.





The Newport Navigator

The Newport Navigator Perpetual Trophy will be awarded to the Sailor who demonstrates the greatest understanding of the Newport Harbor channel and its winds. Hence, "The Newport Navigator Trophy".

Years of local building development has taken its toll on the wind patterns that used to be relied upon for sailing around Newport Harbor. The annual award winner will consistently demonstrate their knowledge of the ever changing winds and, how that sailor will use them to their advantage while sailing in and around Newport Harbor. All Junior Sailors qualify for this "Skill Based Award", Racing and Non-Racing alike.

The trophy consists of a working "Plath" Sextant mounted on Plexi-glass (The Sextant was graciously donated to LIYC for this award by John and Edie Leonis), a wooden base made of walnut is built square so that the award may be taken apart and turned 90 degrees after every ninth award winner. This allows the award to always face the current group of award winners. A hollow bottom intended to act as a sort of 'time capsule', will house pictures of the first, ninth, eighteenth and twenty seventh award winners when the award is taken apart to be turned to another direction. The award has room for twenty seven award winners.

I was Commodore in 2017 and in the three years that I was going through the 'flags', changes made to the program saw our Junior Sailing numbers grow from less than 90 to over 150 as interest grew. The word was out that Lido Sailing IS serious about teaching their sailors and our racing sailors continually brought home awards from home and abroad to prove it! Employing an exemplary Sailing Directors is key and, support from our own Sailing families has made Our Junior program the envy of many other programs in the harbor. Now a Staff Commodore, I am very grateful to have been given the opportunity to sponsor a Perpetual Trophy at home on Lido. It makes Valerie and I proud to see the joy in the faces, continuous growth and successes of all of Lido's young sailors at home. We will always be "LIDO PROUD!"



Activity Report:

San Remo Park Project:

1. Design Update: Dave distributed a landscape plan prepared by Urban Arena. The Committee reviewed the plan and agreed that it contained all of the elements that they had previously approved. There was a discussion of the furniture choice, the shade structure design and the form of irrigation for the turf area. Dave informed the committee that while the presented choices may be the ones we build, the final choices will made at be at our next meeting when we have the estimated costs for these items and all the other facilities totaled to determine if are within budget. If we are not within budget then we will do some "value engineering" to figure out how to reduce our costs to achieve budget.

2. Finance Report: Dave distributed a budget report reflecting the approved \$350,000 reserve account allocation and our expenses to date. To date our paid out and in progress expenses total \$19,300 leaving \$330,700 to complete the project. Some of the committee wondered if this would be enough. Justin mentioned that he would go through the financial records to identify potential additional funding that may be in separate reserve accounts for some of the improvements are included in the definition of the San Remo park project

Antibes Median Rehabilitation:

1. Dave shared the results of the voting by committee members recently on seven "design themes". The results showed a strong preference for design themes 2 and 7. The committee approved combining these two themes into a single theme and authorized Dave to develop with Urban Arena more detailed plans and elevation drawings to be reviewed at our next meeting. This preliminary design under consideration incorporates

- A 12-18 inch walk adjacent to the curb to allow people to easily get out of their cars.
- 2-3 walkways across the width of the median to allow residents to easily walk across the median to their dwellings depending on what side of the median they park. The walkways may be constructed using concrete or pavers.
- Plant materials that are drought tolerant like the landscaping at the Lido House hotel. New irrigation that will primarily be a drip system except where drip doesn't deliver enough
- water to the trees.
- Retaining the color planting area at the monument sign. High quality artificial turf.
- · Plants strategically placed within the median to discourage walkers from cutting trails across the landscaped areas.
- Grading of the planter to raise the planter height so the plant materials are more visible when cars are parked around the median.






