Anyone want to bring high diving back to the Clubhouse?

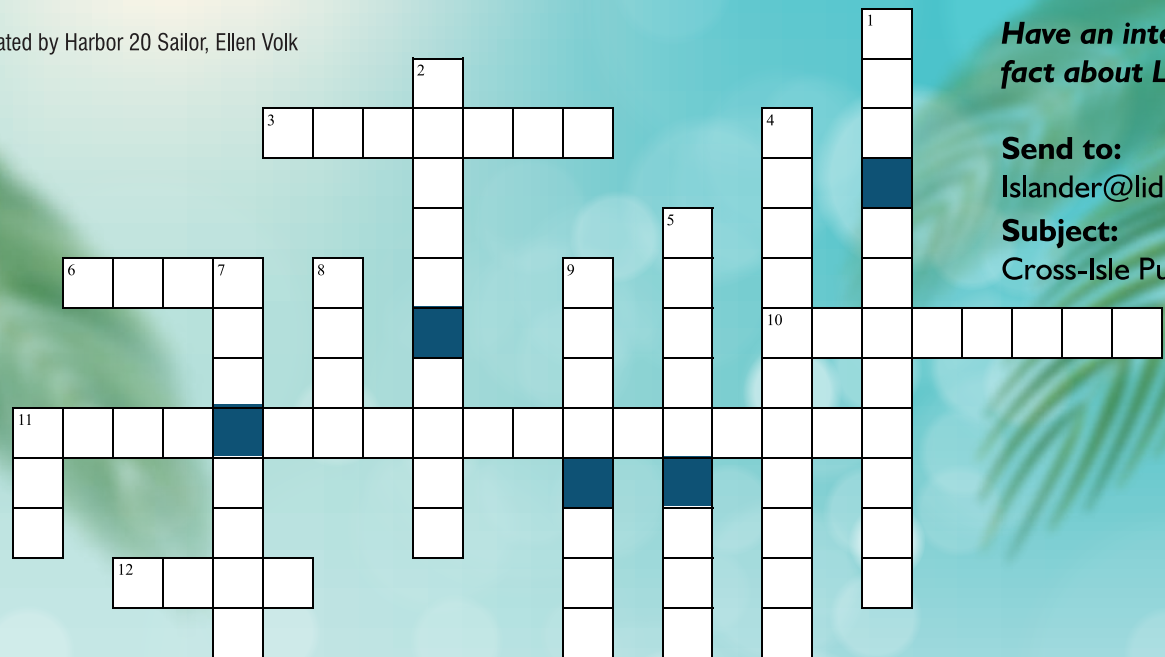
As we enjoy another great summer on Lido Isle, it's fun to reminisce about the earliest Lido summer, 1928. While property sales on Lido got off to a very slow start, the island was still full of activity, centering on Lido's fabulous Moroccan-style clubhouse (the bones of which still stand). John P. Elsbach, one of the early investors in Lido Isle (and also one of the prime movers behind the desert's La Quinta resort area), commissioned acclaimed photographer Dick Whittington to document some of the early activities on the island. This collection is available online through USC's outstanding Doheny Library Collection. Lido traditions come and go, as these photos attest. But summer on Lido is always memorable.

The interior of the Clubhouse, circa 1928, was imaginative, with furnishings that appear to be a modern variation on a Moroccan theme.

Are You Prepared for a Major Disaster?

Now is the time to ready yourself, your family and your neighbors by becoming a LIDO Emergency Response Volunteer.

Following a disaster, Newport Beach's personnel and resources will be severely impacted. Neighborhoods like ours could be on our own for 3 days to 2 weeks. In response to this reality, Newport Beach established its nationally-recognized **Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program**.

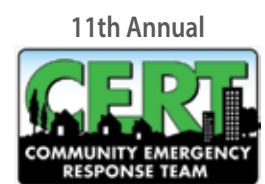
At the core of CERT are teams of residents who have organized at the neighborhood level. In the event of a major disaster, these teams will self-activate in order to assess and report damage, assist with search and rescue activities, and provide first aid to the injured. An essential component of the **CERT** Program is Training. **CERT** Training is delivered in 21 hours of classroom and hands-on instruction. Fall **CERT** classes will begin mid-September. Class schedules and application forms are available on the **CERT** website at www.nbcert.org. Applications are being accepted now. Spaces fill quickly.

Also, put this event in your calendar: In recognition of National Preparedness Month, Newport Beach will be holding its annual **Disaster Preparedness Expo** on the Civic Center Greens on Saturday, September 7th from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. The **Expo** is an excellent opportunity for you to gather information and purchase emergency supplies.

Disaster can strike any time. The time to prepare is now!

Mayor's Message

August 2019



Dear Residents,

I hope you're having a good summer and by the time you read this we are waking up to blue skies every morning – enough with the marine layer!

A brief update on John Wayne Airport and the General Aviation Improvement Plan (GAIP): On June 25, the County Board of Supervisors certified the environmental impact report for the GAIP and took action to advance the project to the next stage.

The plan unanimously advanced by the Board was the result of a compromise solution proposed by Supervisor Michelle Steel and it contained nearly everything the City of Newport Beach had advocated for during the past six months. I consider this an important “win” for our City. Most importantly, there will be only two Fixed based operators (FBOs) permitted to operate at John Wayne and their operations will be constrained through new land use and lease restrictions. Additionally, more than half of the space available for general aviation will be set aside for the smaller and quieter GA planes. This is significant. Please go to the City's website for more information at www.newportbeachca.gov/gaip.

I understand that some residents are disappointed that Newport Beach didn't get everything it wanted. However, at several recent community meetings, I've respectfully encouraged those residents to remember our journey to June 25. We spent many months advocating the project option we felt was best for the community. We were dismayed when that option was soundly defeated by the Board on a 1-4 vote on May 7. We feared the County would move forward with the plan we felt was the worst option for our city. Thankfully, Supervisors Do and Steel intervened and sought to find a compromise that would address most of the city's concerns. And the difficult part of negotiating a compromise is, of course, that no one gets everything they wanted.

June 25th was the first step and there is a lot more work ahead. The County will now embark upon a process to identify the Fixed Based Operators. The City will continue to advocate for additional constraints to help protect our community.

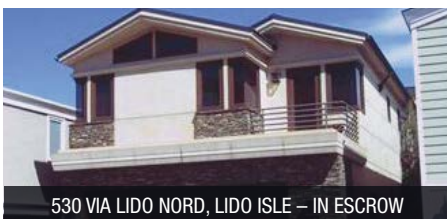

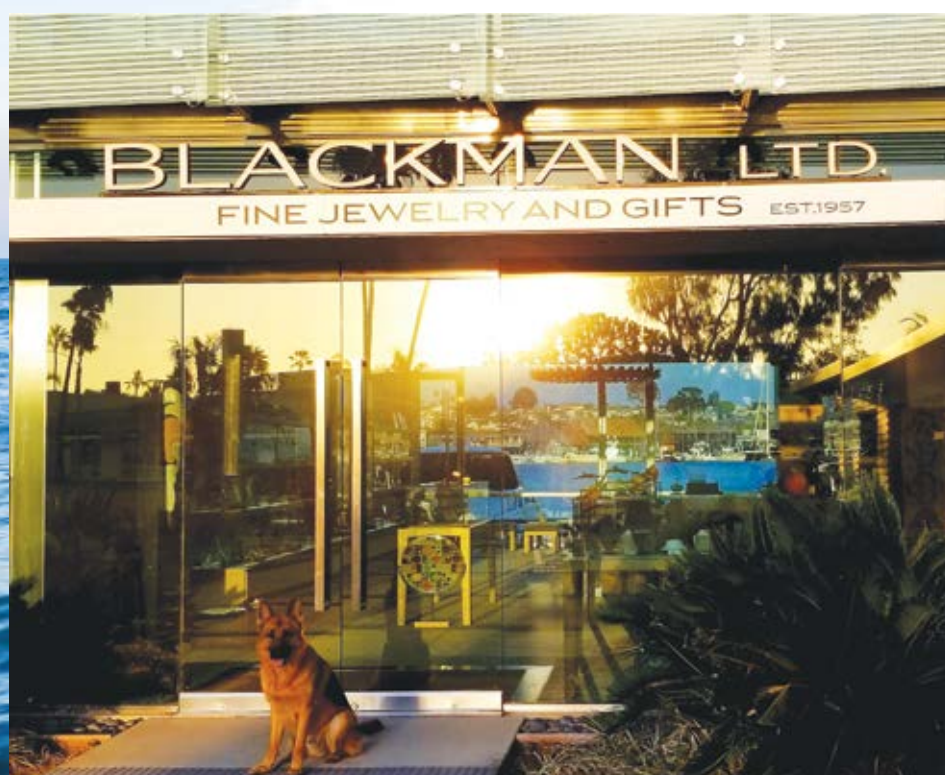
LIYC Cruises Experience “Murder” at the Museum, Catalina and Cocktails
