


McAfee's patio in the 1928 Lido Isle Clubhouse building (Dick Whittington Collection of photos at USC—Doheny Library).

THE LIDO CLUBHOUSE A STAR IS BORN

Hollywood played a big part in the design of the Lido Isle clubhouse. MGM designers Harold Grieve and Harry McAfee were the main design talents behind this center of Lido Isle life, with Grieve handling the interior elements and McAfee the exterior. McAfee had been the art director for dozens of MGM films, but he had a sidelight in architecture. He was particularly inspired by Mediterranean styles. Printed here is a photo from 1925 showing an Andalusian-inspired house that McAfee designed in Los Angeles. While McAfee seemed to cross the Straits of Gibraltar and let his interests in Moroccan architecture inspire his Lido Clubhouse design, one can see that the clubhouse also took some cues from McAfee's Spanish house design elements, such as the cut-outs in the walls, the chimney shapes, and the prominence of the open-air patio (long ago replaced in our clubhouse by the Garden Room). While much of McAfee's design is now lost, having been remodeled out of the clubhouse over the years, we are lucky to have an archive of photos that bring back the unique and inspired atmosphere of the original 1928 clubhouse building.


Tony Vasi TROOP 37 LEADER EXTRAORDINAIRE

Lido Isle residents would recognize Tony, with his sons or other Scouts in tow, as the friendly guy with the truck who picked-up donations for the Annual Yard Sale each June. He also led the scouts in LIYC's Opening Day flag ceremony for several years. Tony was also a contributor in the Newport-Mesa community. He was heavily involved with Newport Harbor High's Football program and Back Bay High School. He coached many seasons of different sports as well.

Attention Lido Parents!

Tips to keep your children safe during an earthquake

Nothing is more important than your child's well-being, especially when disaster strikes. Here's what you should do to prepare your home and family for a major earthquake:

- Take a CPR and first aid class.
- Know the disaster response procedure at your children's school or daycare center. Make plans beforehand to have someone get them if you can't.
- Decide where and when to reunite if your family is apart when an earthquake happens.
- Choose a person outside the immediate area to contact if family members are separated. Long distance phone service will probably be restored sooner than local service.
- Does your child know his or her complete name, address, medications, allergies and your contact information? If not, prepare an emergency card to keep with him/her at all times
- Make sure you have a current photo of each child with you.
- Conduct Earthquake: Duck, Cover & Hold drills every six months with your family.
- It may be unsafe for your child or you to move from one room to another during a quake so discuss the safest place in each room. Stress staying away from heavy furniture, appliances, large glass panes, shelves holding objects, and large decorative masonry such as fireplaces.
- Keep your hallway uncluttered. A hallway can be one of the safest places during an earthquake.
- Establish all the possible ways to exit your house. Keep those areas clear.
- Stay out of kitchens and garages. They tend to be the most dangerous places because of the items kept there.
- Assemble a three-day supply of food, water, clothes, medical supplies and other necessary materials for everyone in your family. Include an extra pair of eyeglasses and house and car keys. Store all these in one place and make sure everyone knows where that is.
- Keep extra cash and change on hand. If electricity is out, ATMs will not be working.
- Make copies of vital records. Take photos of your valuables. Store these electronically on a remotely-accessible server or place them in a safe deposit box in another city.
- Locate the shutoff valves for water, gas and electricity. Learn how to shut off the valves but do not actually turn off the gas. If you have any questions, call your utility company.





As the Summer sailing season comes to a close, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on all of the accomplishments demonstrated by our own Lido Isle Yacht Club Junior sailors. The Summer of 2019 saw the introduction of the Club 420 sailboat into our Junior program. Four of our sailors, who began together as Novices, Ryan Yates, Max Kleha, Ethan Simpson and Reade Decker took to the National circuit of C420 racing. As members of the newly formed Newport Beach Club 420 Race Team, our four sailors joined 16 of their team mates to travel to San Francisco and compete in the C420 North American Championship held at Saint Francis Yacht Club. Overcoming 50-degree waters, cool air temperatures, 30 knots of wind and 95 competitors, our sailors represented LIYC proudly. From San Francisco, they traveled East with their team of 12 to compete in the Hyannis regatta with 120 total boats, the CJ Buckley National Championship of Team Racing and the Buzzards Bay Regatta with 172 C420s. The experience not only provided tremendous sailing training, but lasting friendships and memories were formed.



A special thank you to Vice Commodore Brian Benson. Brian was a familiar smile daily during Summer Sailing and his hard work and planning should not go unnoticed!







San Remo Park Project

Project Bidding Update: The bidding process is underway with five contractors. The bidding period ends on July 31, 2019.

Meeting with Homeowner: Dave reported that on June 18th a Via San Remo resident met with Eric Henn, LICA President, Jarett Tran, Grand Manors Acting General Manager and himself. The homeowner was seeking his third reconsideration of the Board's decision to build a new property line fence and at this meeting proposed that LICA consider doing a lot line adjustment to correct his encroachment on LICA property identified in a survey of the park boundaries. At the July 9, 2019 Board meeting, President Henn President's Report included comments on this matter. As part of his report, various Board members shared their thoughts. This issue was not on the meeting agenda. Dave Rahn was not in attendance at the Board meeting.

Summary Report Review: The MCIC members heard an oral summary of the actions occurring since October 31, 2018 when a Via San Remo neighbor requested LICA to remove the existing 12 foot high vine covered fence and replace it with another fence. Two major issues were discussed: 1. The long term continued use of the previously reported structurally deficient existing fence and 2. Resolving an encroachment of LICA property. Dave presented three of the most likely options to resolve the replacement of the fence and to correct the encroachment. Two options included the possibility of additional LICA costs, moving the completion date to second quarter 2021 (From second quarter 2020) and additional Board, City and MCIC administrative meetings After considering the impacts of each option, the MCIC voted unanimously to recommend that the Board continue the project as currently designed and approved.

San Remo Playground Equipment: Vicki reported on her updated discussions with Sun Country Systems President. The MCIC reviewed a firm contract price provided by Tim Hollinger. The cost of the artificial turf below the playground equipment at San Remo has increased. Vicki is negotiating with Tim on this additional cost.

Genoa Park Rehabilitation Project:

1. Genoa Park Committee Report: MCIC members and the head of the Genoa Park Playground committee, Vicki Barns, reviewed the new playground equipment that has been planned for this park. She shared renderings of the equipment.

Antibes and Piazza Median Projects:

- 1. Antibes and Piazza Lido Median Rehabilitation: The City and the MCIC have been focused on getting final landscape plans for the Piazza and Antibes medians approved by the city and the LICA Board since these plans are required to support the new required master encroachment permit. The MCIC reviewed the recently proposed landscape renderings of the Antibes median. Dave reported that some the Board members have expressed thoughts to defer these projects until next fiscal year even though the current year budget includes funds available for these projects. The MCIC agreed to move forward to present the updated plans for City comments prior to the August 14 Board meeting. Then assuming their agreement, seek the Board's approval on the designs because spending on this project will likely not occur until 2020 because of the City's requirement that LICA and the City enter into a master encroachment permit to manage five medians on Lido prior to starting work, solicit construction bids and perform the work when it doesn't conflict with major holiday periods and the summer season.
- 2. <u>Median Encroachment Permits:</u> President Eric has started independently researching the terms of the existing individual encroachment permits between LICA and the City that have previously been obtained and reviewed by the MCIC. Work on the master encroachment permit language under Eric's supervision will be decided by him.




