UPDATES FROM NBPD:

Bike Theft Up Over 100% From Last Year

Hello Neighbors,

Summer is in full force. Having said that, I would like to address some of the main issues our area of Newport Beach encounters. The information below is from the N.B.P.D.

Residential Burglaries:

Recent residential burglary trends tell us that burglars tend to target houses they think are unoccupied, shatter windows or glass doors to get in, and often operate during dinnertime hours. They also frequently break in through a second story entry point.

Here's what you can do: Make sure it looks like the house is occupied, so have interior lights on during normal hours (this may mean getting your lights on a timer or using smart light bulbs you can control from your phone). Be sure to set your alarm. Use a motion detector in your master bedroom when you're away – the master bedroom is the most targeted room for burglaries. Ladders should be stored in the garage so burglars don't use them for their own purposes. We've also seen them stack furniture, climb on barbeques, etc. to get into an open window or on a balcony, so be sure to secure those areas and not create any easy opportunities for them.

Garage Burglaries:

We've seen garage burglaries steadily increase over the last couple of years, so we ask residents who have personal garages and who use parking structures to be diligent about securing their property in those areas. Even in private parking structures, you should secure your bike and car as if they were outside (using a good lock, not leaving property visible, etc.). Personal garage doors need to be closed whenever you are not present. A burglary from an open garage takes seconds.

Bike Thefts:

As of mid-May, bike thefts were up over 100% from last year; and that's before summer, which is the busiest season for this crime. A large number of these thefts are of electric bikes.

We encourage residents to secure their bikes with a good quality lock (cable locks are easily cut). Also, please register your bike at Project529 by giving the serial #, a few details about the bike and your contact info (don't forget to add a picture of yourself with the bike!). It's free, takes about 5 minutes and can help law enforcement get the bike back to you if it's stolen.

Traffic:

Traffic concerns can be directed to NBPD's Traffic Division at 949-644-3742. Please try to be as specific as you can when requesting additional traffic patrols (your specific concern, time of day, days of the week, specific cross streets, etc.). The Traffic Division will deploy resources as they are available.

Homelessness:

There are 20 shelter beds to serve the homeless population of Newport Beach. Once those are filled, the homeless are offered social services. If you see a member of the homeless population that needs urgent attention, please contact the Police Department. More information about homelessness in Newport Beach is available on the City's website.

Suspicious Activity:

To report suspicious activity, please call the non-emergency dispatch number 949-644-3717. The Police Department asks residents to alert us when you see anything that does not look right – you could help prevent a crime!

The Future of Lido's Emergency Response Depends on Volunteers!

Lido's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) met in June to discuss the future of our disaster preparedness and response program. The meeting was chaired by Lido CERT's new coordinator, Scott Obel.

Lido's disaster response plan depends on having volunteer block captains who will survey their block to record damage, injuries, and situations that could potentially lead to more injuries or loss of life. Block captains will then report their findings to the Newport Beach Fire Department to assist them in making decisions regarding the allocation of resources. With high density areas like apartments and high rise office buildings, Lido may not receive assistance for hours or even days following a disaster. Therefore, the island needs to be as independent as possible. We can do this by having educated, prepared homeowners as well as an organized and trained team of resident volunteers. Lido CERT's team has lost many of its members. We need volunteers!

Members of the CERT team are encouraged to take the CERT Training Program where participants learn about

hazards that may impact their area and are trained in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Future articles in the Islander will announce upcoming training sessions.

While volunteers are there to help, they can't do it all. At least one person in each home should have first aid training, so Lido CERT plans to offer basic first aid classes to our residents. Also, the CERT shed at San Remo park has disaster response supplies and communication equipment, it does not have food or water for residents. Every household should have, among other things, at least a three day supply of food and water. Future Islander articles will include information on assembling a Disaster Preparedness Kit.

Those of us who met in June and those who couldn't make the meeting but are still interested in being on the team, are looking forward to a revitalized emergency preparation and response program on Lido. Join us!

Mose Lido Boat Notes

NEWPORT'S-OWN BOATYARD... If a Lido resident wanted to have someone build a boat for them around 1930-1962, they might well have turned to the South Coast Shipyard located on Newport Boulevard right next to the Crab Cooker's location. The Shipyard was founded by local resident Walton Hubbard (1908-1944) who was also an accomplished sailor, having won the Star Internationals

race in 1927 (and as we have mentioned in past months, the Star 23-foot keelboat was an important boat class back in those days). Hubbard commissioned prominent marine architect Philip Rhodes to design several sailboat types to serve the needs of the leisure sailor. Among these were the Albatross (as owned by Humphrey Bogart [Slug Nutty] and Lido's-own Margene Musser [Nocturne]), the Falcon and the Rhodes 33. The boatyard also worked under naval contract during World War II producing dozens of minesweepers, patrol boats, crash boats and sub-chasers.


AND SPEAKING OF BOGART'S SAILBOAT SANTANA...Last month, Old Isle did make a brief mention of Humphrey Bogart's yacht, Santana, one of the most famous boats to ply Newport Harbor's waters. Santana does have a minor Lido Isle history even though Bogart didn't live on Lido. Santana's beginnings were up in Los Angeles where the 55-foot yawl was commissioned in 1935 by William Lyman Stewart, Jr., the son of the founder of Union Oil Company. The yacht was designed by Sparkman & Stephens and locally built by Wilmington Boat Works (also known as WILBO) up in the Los Angeles Harbor area.

Santana changed hands a number of times over the years, but for brief periods was owned by Hollywood stars and Lido Isle residents Ray Milland (who only owned Santana for three months and has three addresses on Lido associated with him: 117 Via Lido Soud, 724 Via Lido Nord and 928 Via Lido Nord) and Dick Powell and June Allyson (again, relatively brief owners of the yacht, and residents at 101 Via Genoa, although the Powells probably didn't own Santana while they lived in that house!). June Allyson insisted that Santana be fitted with a secure jewelry box since who wants to sail without their diamonds! Dick Powell sold Santana to Bogart for \$50,000 in 1945. Bogart was a member of Newport Harbor Yacht Club and Los Angeles Yacht Club and was a life-long sailor who grew up sailing in the Finger Lakes area of New York with his father, a successful surgeon. Bogart kept Santana until his death in 1957. Bogart's prized scale model of Santana was prominently displayed at his funeral. Do Google Santana for lots of online views.

Old Isle loves to do a spot of shopping and noticed online that Indonesian company Malinda Furniture Gallery will sell you a newly made copy of the model of Santana, very similar to the one Bogey owned and cherished. It's only \$4000 or so and can double as a table. Sounds like a great gift for someone!

MESSING ABOUT IN BOATS...Lauren Bacall, Bogart's wife and major Hollywood star in her own right, made an interesting observation in a Los Angeles Times interview dated November 15, 1996, about Newport Harbor's annual Flight of the Snowbirds (the predecessor race to the current Flight of the Lasers, which takes place each summer). In her interview with reporter Janice Page, Bacall recalled that, "All these little kids once a year would sail these little boats, these little Snowbirds, with one little sail. That was fabulous. I thought, God, a child can grow up doing things like that?"

I'm sure many parents and grandparents on Lido would enthusiastically echo Bacall's sentiments (and thanks to the Christopher Trela 2014 article which brought this wonderful Bacall quote to Old Isle's attention.) Here's to another great summer of Lido Isle sailing and envying Lido Isle's lucky sailing children!!!

The City has launched a new anti-litter campaign that will run for the duration of the summer, through Labor Day, with a special focus on our beach areas. The theme of the campaign is "Make a Splash, Pick up Trash: Keep Newport Beach Beautiful." Over the course of the summer, residents and visitors will see colorful campaign signs at the entrances to beaches, around public parks and City facilities in beach areas, and displayed by participating private businesses.



The purpose of the anti-litter campaign is twofold:

- Education and awareness.

 contractors do a great job of
 cleaning and maintaining our
 public spaces, but they can't be
 everywhere, at all times. One
 of the goals of this campaign
 is to create awareness and
 remind everyone that all of
 us—residents, business owners,
 visitors and City government—

 "Keep Newport Beach
 Beautiful."
- Highlighting an expanded volunteer program. The City has updated and expanded its volunteer program to better align individual volunteers and groups with the areas of the City that need the most attention.

The alley reconstruction project for Utility Undergrounding District 116/116B is in progress. The City is now reconstructing some of the alleys off Balboa Boulevard between 46th Street and 38th Street that were affected by the utility undergrounding work. Pavement rehabilitation on Balboa Boulevard from W. Coast Highway to 12th Street and Medina Way to G Street, will begin later this year.

The pavement project to restore the street surfaces at Via Lido Soud, Via Lido Nord and Via Antibes following the Lido Isle water main replacement project is now complete. The project involved removing the top layer of the existing pavement and repaving the streets, reconstructing deteriorated concrete curbs and sidewalk areas and adding several new ADA curb ramps.

Brief update on the Gateway Park Project:


The refresh of the Gateway Park landscaping is in final design. The project will change out some of the older, overgrown landscaping but keep the iconic palms. The work will also update the signage, repair the landscape walls, and install new lighting. Construction will take place this winter.

Shredded Kale Galad with Grapefruit

SERVES: 2 people TOTAL TIME: 20 mins

FOR THE APPLE CIDER VINAIGRETTE:

2 tbsp extra virgin olive oil2 tbsp apple cider vinegar

I tsp dijon mustard

I tbsp honey

1/4 tsp smoked paprika

1/2 tsp kosher salt 1/2 tsp black pepper FOR THE SALAD:

I head lacinato kale stem removed and thinly

sliced (about 6 cups)

I honeycrisp apple thinly sliced and halved

½ cup dry roasted and salted almonds,

roughly chopped

I grapefruit cut into supremes *see note

½ cup grated aged cheddar cheese

In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, apple cider vinegar, dijon mustard, honey, smoked paprika, salt and pepper until well combined. Set aside.

In a large bowl, combine the kale, apple and almonds. Pour the dressing over the salad and toss until well coated and the kale has slightly wilted, 3 to 4 minutes.

Add the grapefruit and the grated cheddar and gently toss once more.

Serve with desired protein such as salmon, and enjoy!!

Salmon Method: drizzle a 6 ounce filet of wild caught salmon with a little bit of olive oil and lightly sprinkled with salt and pepper. Cook in an airfryer at 375 degrees until it flakes easily with a fork, about 8 minutes.

NOTE: To make beautiful, juicy little grapefruit segments with no pith or skin, set the peeled grapefruit on a cutting board and use a thin, sharp knife to cut down the sides of the fruit, just through the remaining pith and membranes, to reveal the flesh underneath. Then, remove each segment of grapefruit by cutting along the sides of the segments to release from the membranes, removing the seeds as you go.


