Safety Barriers... Something to Think About

Fall is in the air, summer is history and the month ends with a festive night of trick or treat. Yes, October is here and things have settled down from June through September. As I have always stated though, never let your guard down and always be aware of your surroundings.

Even though the crowds and activity around our community have diminished, there is still plenty of things to pay attention to. The constant construction on the Isle brings many people here for work. Most of the construction crews are people working hard and just trying to make a living. Unfortunately, some come on to Lido posing as construction people, trying to blend in, and look for opportunities. So, as a reminder, please close your garage door if you are not present. If the weather is warm and you are airing out your garage area, close your door and only leave a small gap open. Remember to completely close your garage door at a later time. Do not invite unwanted eyes to be aware of your personal belongings. Also, lock your vehicles at all times and remove your items or hide them. Again, do not entice someone to target your vehicle.

Regarding Halloween... Please pay attention to all the kids on the streets and sidewalks. If you are driving during the trick or treat hours, please exercise a large amount of caution. Watch your speed and be prepared for kids to be crossing the streets. Conversely, parents please advise your kids about safety protocols whether you are with them or not. It would be a good idea if you and or your kids have a flashlight and or a glow stick as well. That can be used for alerting oncoming vehicles, navigating crowds and watching for potential hazards while walking.

Lastly, we are all thankful no one was hurt during the incident that occurred at the Via Genoa beach park. Apparently, another incident involving a vehicle took place at the same location two weeks prior. While these accidents are rare, it is not rare enough if you are involved and injured, or God forbid worse, from someone's poor decisions. Maybe it is time to consider some safety barriers that you see present at schools, places of worship, and government institutions. It should not take a tragedy to implement some sort of safety barrier. We are very lucky so far with the outcome of the last two incidents. Something to at least pause and think about.

Several City Projects in Progress

Be on the lookout for November Town Hall Meeting



It's hard to believe, but this is my final column as your Council representative. My City Council term ends in early December when my successor takes his seat on the dais. It has been the honor of my lifetime to serve our Lido neighbors, the residents of District I and the people of Newport Beach. It's too early for farewells now, but I'm beginning to realize the transition day is fast approaching!

In the meantime, we still have project news to report. I'd like to update you on a few City projects of interest to Lido and Peninsula area residents.

- Construction of the long-awaited Junior Lifeguard Building will begin this month, following the award of a \$6.4 million contract approved by the Council in August. The new facility is expected to be completed by Memorial Day 2023, in time for the summer season. The new, 5,400 square-foot facility will be located near the Balboa Pier and serve as a permanent home for the City's popular Junior Lifeguard program. Importantly, the building will be available for various public uses when the Junior Lifeguard program is not in session. These public uses may include fitness classes, education courses, facility rentals, community meetings and more.
- The City has hired a consulting firm to gather community input and develop concepts to rehabilitate Newport Pier while improving McFadden Square and the surrounding beach, parking and bike path areas. The project will examine potential improvements to make the area more attractive and safer, along with additional amenities to better serve our residents and visitors. The City's consultant, SWA Group, will conduct at least 10 public meetings before developing three concepts and architectural renderings for consideration. Stay tuned for more information on opportunities to give your valuable input on this important project.

- Designs are complete for the Gateway Park (at the entrance to Lido Village) landscaping improvements, and the City is now advertising for construction bids. The project will repair the landscape walls, refresh the landscaping and landscape lighting, and replace the entrance signage. The existing donation trees will remain in place, and the grass area will be replaced with fresh turf. The project is expected to begin this winter and be completed by late spring.
- City staff is examining ways to improve safety at the busy intersection of Via Lido and Via Oporto in Lido Village. While the plans are still preliminary, the recommendation is likely to include relocating the existing crosswalk to improve traffic flow and pedestrian safety.

On a final note: Please be on the lookout for an announcement about my last town hall meeting as a Council member, which will take place in mid-November. I look forward to meeting with residents to give a fall update and introduce my successor for the District I Council seat.

LICA recently added cameras to the Jucar backstop and basketball area. This addition, along with the other cameras located at LICA facilities, will help to maintain safety and security.

Genoa Park Repair Update

LICA is in the process of replacing the damaged play equipment and repairing the wall and dock back to original condition at the Genoa Park. The addition of safety barriers is also being looked at. The old teetertotter will be replaced as well, and the remaining equipment will be reviewed for safety compliance. We anticipate installation of the new equipment in January 2023 - it takes that long to order and receive it. Dock repair will require City and Coastal Commission coordination and will take a bit longer.

Thank you to Lido resident Vicki Barnes for assisting with the selection and installation of appropriate play equipment. She has helped with all our LIDO park updates over the years and continues to be a wonderful expert resource. As a former school administrator, she (as she puts it) "speaks playground fluently."



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Lido-Legal Eagles


Now for a little legal history...Lido has been home to many attorneys over the years, but one of the most prominent is Dana Latham (1898-1974). Latham had a second home at 653 Via Lido Soud. During his legal career, Latham served various governmental roles and was once Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service in the Eisenhower administration. However, his fame in the legal world is primarily as name partner of super law firm Latham & Watkins, which Latham founded in Los Angeles in 1934 with Paul Watkins, now a global firm of over 3000 attorneys.

Another part-time Lido resident with connections to the LA legal community is Donald O'Melveny (1891-1942), who shared a primary home in South Pasadena (1305 Garfield, designed by Reginald Johnson, architect of the Santa Barbara Biltmore, as well as many other prominent homes and buildings) and a second home on Lido with his wife, Philadelphia. Donald was not an attorney but was the youngest son of the founder of the prominent LA law firm O'Melveny & Myers, Henry O'Melveny (1859-1941). Donald was proud owner of the yacht Philadelphia, named after his wife. A fun film, posted online by the Huntington Library, is called "Sunset Club Outing," dated June 1939. The film shows Donald and friends (including someone who bears a strong resemblance to Henry O'Melveny) at Donald's Lido home, as well as sailing in Newport Harbor aboard the Philadelphia. Some other interesting scenes take place at the Bolsa Chica Gun Club. The film has no sound, and the scenes of Lido are not great, but the Newport Harbor scenes are well worth looking at. https://californiarevealed.org/ islandora/object/cavpp%3A30880

The O'Melveny Lido home, located at 924 Via Lido Nord, was constructed early in Lido's history, around 1938, and the architect was Glendale-based Graham Latta, who was active in the Los Angeles area

at the time designing mostly municipal and educational-use buildings. There was coverage of the O'Melveny Lido house in the LA Times of the period, which cites the home's "Venetian architectural influence" and "barbecue and ping-pong courts adjoining a large paved court overlooking the bay" (LA Times, May 1, 1938). Sounds pretty dreamy in a modern-day Lido where "ping pong courts" are hard to come by!

An interesting tangent to this story is that Donald died at a young 51, leaving his widow Philadelphia. She remained at their South Pasadena home and had many friends in the Pasadena area, including Julia McWilliams, who introduced Phila to her father, John Mc Williams. Although Mr. McWilliams was fifteen years Phila's senior, the pair got married, with Phila thereby becoming stepmother to Julia, who was soon to become Julia Child, everyone's favorite French chef. 

Overnight Pumpkin Spice Oatmeal

Ingredients (Serves 2)

I cup rolled oats

1½ cups milk of choice, water, or a mix of the two

2 tbs maple syrup

1/4 tsp ginger

½ tsp cinnamon

1/8 tsp allspice

1/8 tsp nutmeg

½ cup pumpkin puree (not pumpkin pie filling)

1/4 tsp kosher salt


