CERT is Recruiting Lido Residents to Become Co-Block Captains

At the monthly CERT meeting held August 13th the group decided to hold monthly meetings on a regular basis on the SECOND Saturday of each month at 10am at the clubhouse. The group discussed on island training for First Aid, Gas Meter Safety and Awareness, and Fire Prevention.

Since the last meeting many block captains active before the pandemic have been contacted, with some confirming their interest in being block captains. Many thanks to all those who attended the last meeting and helped to recruit new members and block captains and who contacted recent block captains to confirm their interest in remaining as block captains.

CERT will publish monthly articles in the Islander to provide tips and thoughts about disaster preparedness to help residents. Following is the first of these.

Ensuring Ample and Safe Water Following a Disaster

Good news: our water supply will withstand a major earthquake. Bad news: there will probably be serious damage to the pipes delivering that water, especially in liquefaction areas like Lido. Here's what you should know to ensure that you have enough safe water following a disaster.

Storing and Purifying Your Emergency Water Supply

- The minimum drinking water supply is one gallon per person per day. You will also need water for food preparation, bathing, brushing teeth, and dish washing. Store a 3-5 day supply of water (at least 5 gallons for each person).
- Water should be stored in sturdy plastic bottles with tight-fitting lids. They should be cleaned with a bleach solution before using and reusing. Rinsed chlorine bleach bottles work well for water storage. Plastic containers for juice and milk do not work as well because they tend to crack and leak more readily. All containers should be labeled.
- Stored water should be changed every 6 months.
- Avoid placing water containers in areas where toxic substances, such as gasoline and pesticides, are present. Vapors may penetrate the plastic over time.
- Do not store water containers in direct sunlight. Select a place with a fairly constant, cool temperature.

Safe Water Sources in the Home

If you do not have enough water stored, there are sources in your home that may provide safe, clean water for drinking purposes.

- Water drained from the water heater faucet, if the water heater has not been damaged.
- Water dipped from the tank of the toilet (not the bowl). The water in the bowl can be used for pets. Do not use water that has been chemically treated or "blue" water.
- Melted ice cubes.
- Canned fruit, vegetable juice, and liquids from other canned goods.
- Carbonated beverages do not meet drinking water requirements.
- Caffeinated drinks and alcohol dehydrate the body, increasing the need for drinking water.
- Water from swimming pools and spas can be used for personal hygiene, cleaning, and related uses, but not for drinking.

Unsafe Water Sources

Never use water from these sources for drinking.

Radiators
 Hot water boilers (home heating system)
 Water beds

Water for Drinking and Cooking

Safe drinking water includes bottled, boiled, or treated water. Here are some general rules concerning water for drinking and cooking. Remember:

- Do not use contaminated water to wash dishes, brush your teeth, wash and prepare food, or make ice.
- If you use bottled water, make sure the seal has not been broken. Otherwise, water should be boiled or treated before use.
- Boiling water kills harmful bacteria and parasites. Bringing water to a rolling boil for one minute will kill most organisms.
- If you can't boil water, you can treat water with chlorine or iodine tablets or unscented household chlorine bleach. If you use chlorine tablets or iodine tablets, follow the directions that come with the tablets. If you use household chlorine bleach, add 1/8 teaspoon of bleach per gallon of water if the water is clear. For cloudy water, add 1/4 teaspoon of bleach per gallon. Mix the solution thoroughly and let it stand for about 30 minutes before using it. Remember, however, that chlorine tablets, iodine tablets, or liquid bleach will not kill many parasitic organisms. Boiling is the best way to kill these organisms.

E-BIKE SAFETY

for Bikers & Drivers

Dear Neighbors,

I want to provide an update on the e-bike issue that is generating much community interest and concern.

This summer, the Newport Beach Police Department began conducting specialized operations aimed at addressing unsafe e-bike traffic through enforcement and education.

The first such operation, on July 9, focused on the heavily used peninsula area, including the oceanfront boardwalk. Officers were deployed to the boardwalk and surrounding areas to observe, educate, and enforce unsafe operations, with the help of speed measuring devices. The July operation resulted in 198 contacts with boardwalk users and 60 citations or warnings.

The City has seen the use of e-bikes increase on Newport Beach streets, sidewalks, trails and bike paths in recent years. Unfortunately, we have also seen an increase in traffic law violations that have prompted safety concerns. Complaints from residents include children not wearing helmets, unsafe operations, California Vehicle Code violations, and near collisions between e-bike riders and pedestrians.

The City's goal is to encourage the safe and responsible operation of e-bikes by residents and visitors. On August 23 the Newport Beach City Council will host a study session to explore additional options to increase e-bike safety. If the Council decides to pursue further action, residents will have additional opportunities to provide comment and input at future public meetings. I encourage you to write to the city council to express your opinion: citycouncil@newportbeachca.gov.

The Newport Beach Police Department suggests the following safety tips for all bicyclists and vehicle drivers:

Bike Riders

- Use lights at night (at minimum, a front white light and a rear red reflector).
- Although not required for riders 18 and older, always wear a properly secured helmet. Helmets significantly reduce the chance of a head injury in the event of a crash.
- Bicyclists must travel in the same direction of traffic and have the same requirements as any slow-moving vehicle.
- Yield to pedestrians, just as a driver would. Pedestrians have the right-of-way within marked crosswalks or within unmarked crosswalks at intersections.

Drivers

- Slow down and follow the speed limit.
- Be careful traveling through intersections.
- Look carefully for bicyclists and pedestrians before making a turn or opening a car door near streets or bike paths.
- Be patient when traveling behind a bicyclist.
- Maintain at minimum three feet of space when passing or overtaking a bicyclist.
- Never drive distracted or impaired.

I hope to see you at future public meetings when the Council considers new policy on e-bikes. I will continue to provide updates.


There are a number of interesting volumes to collect if you are interested in the history of Newport Beach and surrounding areas. One of these is The Islands and Ports of California by Duncan Gleason, published in 1958 (the Newport Beach Public Library Bookstore is a good source for reasonably priced books on our local history). In particular, Gleason's words on Lido Isle Yacht Club caught Old Isle's eye:

On Lido Isle is located the elegant home of the Lido Island (sic) Yacht Club, organized in 1928, with its membership limited to property owners on the island. In addition to two summer regattas, it conducts a novel seaman's sailing race in the fall, wherein the boats are anchored with everyone snugged down below until the starting gun is fired. Then all is frantic activity as the crews burst out on deck to get sail on and the anchor up. At the marker, a reef has to be taken and shaken out before the finish line is reached, when a harbor furl must be made.

Sounds like an interesting event!

As many of you may know, our local harbor was without its own yacht club until 1917, when Newport Harbor Yacht Club was launched. Until then, the closest yacht club was South Coast Yacht Club in San Pedro (founded in 1901), although they did establish a branch of the SCYC in 1911 here in Newport called Station A of the South Coast Yacht Club. Balboa Yacht Club came along in 1922, founded as the Southland Sailing Club, focusing initially on small-boat racing. And then, of course, our own LIYC in 1928, when home sales on our island started.

Old Isle has been off on a boat tangent since its coverage of Humphrey Bogart's boats, Slugnutty and Santana. It came to our attention that the streets in Irvine Terrace, a Newport neighborhood developed in the 1950s, are named after prominent local sailboats and power boats. Santana Terrace is one of those names, named after Bogart's sailboat. There is also Galatea Terrace, named after a 68-foot yawl owned by violinist Jascha Heifetz (1901-1987) that used to ply the waters of Newport Harbor. Lido Isle resident, actor Dick Powell, who briefly owned Santana, also once owned Galatea, which still sails today. If you are interested in reading more about the history of the boats which inspired Irvine Terrace's street names, google "Irvine terrace street names" for a full rundown compiled by noted local yachtsman and writer, John Blaich, in 2001.




Through various confusing alliances and mergers, South Coast Yacht Club eventually became affiliated with California Yacht Club in San Pedro/Wilmington. This postcard dates from 1937.


If you have ever wondered how we ended up moving our cars back and forth every Tuesday and Friday for street sweeping, a vote of island residents in 1976 sealed the deal. By a margin of 331 to 301, island residents supported weekly street sweeping, and the LICA board confirmed this with a vote of 4 in favor, 2 against and one abstention. A controversy, well covered in local papers, brewed afterwards

Coastline Conservation Commission (predecessor to the Coastal Commission) approval had to be sought for approval to erect the signs regulating the street sweeping days, since some contended that the signs would be "visual pollution" and a "development", putting them under the purview of the state agency. But the 260 signs went up at the order of the city attorney, and fines for non-compliance were set at \$10! Those were the days!

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Proposed Lido House Hotel Expansion

On July 21, 2022, the city's Planning Commission unanimously approved plans for a 15,103-square-foot expansion of the Lido House Hotel. The additional floor area at the existing 130-room hotel would allow the construction of five new cottages, increased storage space, enlarged pre-function/breakout meeting rooms, a new greenhouse seating room, expansion of three existing hotel rooms, and an enclosed area on the rooftop terrace. Also included is demolition of the former Fire Station No. 2 building to create additional public and private parking spaces. The architectural style of the improvements will be consistent with the existing Lido House Hotel.

The Land Use Element of the General Plan, Local Coastal Program and Zoning Code would need to be amended to accommodate the proposed project. The maximum gross floor area allowed on the site would be increased from 103,470 to 118,573 square feet. NB City Council executed a long-term ground lease and approved the existing hotel project in 2014. The hotel opened to great success in 2018. R.D. Olson Development President

and CEO, Bob Olson, believes that the added area and additional cottages will help make the hotel even more successful.

Next step: The NB City Council is scheduled to review the project on September 13, 2022. If approved by the Council, the project will then head to the Coastal Commission for final approval. "**THE BEAR**" SPAGHETTI

Ingredients:

½ C extra virgin olive oil
6 garlic cloves peeled and smashed
2 C fresh basil leaves including stems
2 28 oz cans San Marzano crushed tomatoes
½ stick unsalted butter
I yellow onion peeled and halved
I tbsp crushed red pepper
Kosher salt to taste
I lb dry spaghetti

Infused Oil: Add olive oil, garlic, basil leaves, stems, red pepper flakes to heavy pot – simmer for 5 minutes, remove from heat, cover, let cool. Once cool, puree ingredients in Cuisinart or blender.

Sauce: Place butter in heavy pot, lightly brown then place two onion halves in pan, cut side down. Gently brown in the butter for 3-5 more minutes. Next add crushed tomatoes, simmer 10 minutes, stir. Discard onions, add oil puree. Stir, simmer 10 minutes, add salt to taste.

Pasta: Bring water to boil, add salt then dry pasta. Cook to al dente. Set aside I C pasta water before draining, use if needed to add moisture to sauce. Toss drained pasta in sauce and simmer for I-2 minutes. Serve with fresh basil leaves, crushed red pepper and Parmesan cheese garnish. Prego!

ANNOUNCEMENT EXECUTIVE SESSION:

In accordance with Civil Code Section 4935(a) the Board met in Executive Session prior to the General Session meeting on July 13th, 2022, to consider litigation, matters relating to the formation of contracts with third parties, member discipline, personnel matters, or to meet with a member, upon the member's request, regarding the member's payment of assessments as specified in Civil Code.

Four (4) homeowners were in attendance to address the following topics:

- John Devir: Budget review to manage toward potential fiscal tightening (exempting security) given potential for an economic downturn that may affect revenue and costs.

Approval of June 8, 2022, Minutes

A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously carried to approve the June 8th, 2022, General Minutes as corrected.

Treasurer's Report:

1. Financial Review May 2022 John Devir

A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously carried to approve the May 31, 2022 financials as prepared by GrandManors subject to year end audit. The report reflects as follows:

Replacement Fund FTD \$1,308,009.00
Cash at the end period \$3,221,344.00

Director Devir will be reviewing the issue related to banking account balances being above FDIC insurance coverage limit.

2. Collection Update

No action necessary.

Committee Reports:

1. Architectural Committee

A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously carried to ratify and approve the architectural meeting minutes dated June 6, 2022, and June 20, 2022 minutes.

2. Clubhouse/Snack bar/Events

- a. Interior Clubhouse refresh update (Ken Wrigler) The refresh is almost complete. Security guard to open and close the doors. Need to train security guards regarding the steps to open and close the doors. Need to amend directive accordingly. Clubhouse Grand Re-Opening Party was a success. Approximately 300 plus people attended. No action was taken.
- b. Interior audio sound system (Ken Wrigler) The system is complete and working well. Garden Room sound level attenuation was poor as that was not included in the scope of the Clubhouse update. Keys to the audio room will remain with the Association personnel. Audio system user guide will be prepared for users/members. No action was taken.

3. Marine Facilities

Antibes Crane Update (Ken Wirgler) – The Antibes crane project has been completed. No action was taken.

4. <u>Tennis</u>

Director O'Hara discussed the tennis court maintenance concerns. Update list of maintenance/repair items to be prepared and distributed at future meetings. Windscreens will not be replaced as additional cleaning has proved sufficient. No further action was taken.

5. Entry Bridge/City Relations

Director Richley will contact the City regarding the resident concern regarding the missing "no outlet sign" at the entrance to the island. Grass and waterline issue at the entry to be reviewed and resolved.

6. Security/Traffic Safety/CERT

- a. **CERT** CERT is being reinitiated and moving forward.
- b. **BBC Camera** No update.

c. Patrol Bids and Complaints

A motion was made, seconded, and unanimously carried to approve the revised patrol service contract from Southwest Patrol. The Board will proceed with a 90-day trial contract with Southwest Patrol, contingent on submitting the contract to the LICA General Counsel for review. Furthermore, the Board will update the annual budget to reflect the newly approved contract amount pending vendor performance. The new billable hourly rate for an unarmed officer is \$39.00 per hour and \$55.00 per hour for each armed officer.

7. Landscaping

a. Landscape Updates

Director Cunningham provided landscape maintenance updates as follows:

- Waziers/Soud end park pear trees have blight.
- The trees needed to be pruned for blight.
- They can only be pruned back to a certain extent to preserve the integrity of the tree. Tree trimming will be addressed in the fall.

b. Landscape Proposals - Lawrie Cunningham

Reviewed proposal for Zurich Via Lido Nord proposal to remove existing sand/soil from the planter and to convert to drip irrigation. Proposal not approved based upon cost benefit evaluation.

c. Landscape Proposal
