### First Aid Classes Being Planned

CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) is a group of resident volunteers organized to assist other residents in the event of an emergency.

CERT group members met on Saturday the 8th and discussed their current objectives that are

centered around rebuilding the core of block captains. Members present reviewed and discussed a current listing of 73 members and were then provided lists for more in depth review so that a confirmed, accurate listing is available. The group has recruited new members since the June meeting.

A digital map was generated from the city's resources and will be used to indicate block captains and the areas they cover.

All known CERT members with email addresses were contacted last week from lido.cert.nb@gmail.com with reminders of the Saturday meeting. If you are a CERT member or want to become one, please email lido.cert.nb@gmail.com to let the group know.

Beyond block captains, CERT is working to provide residents with instruction on First Aid, gas meter safety and more. With the holidays approaching, the goal is to have a first aid class available to interested residents. Times and days are being considered for the meetings and CERT welcomes input as it recognizes that Saturday's may not be convenient for families with children. Weeknights are also possible. # A Beginner's Guide to STORING FOOD for an EMERGENCY



Have you assembled your Disaster Kit yet? Does it include at least 3 days of food for everyone in your household? Should you just fill your freezer and cook meals when you need them? NO...following a disaster, there may be power outages lasing for several days.

Here is important information on selecting, storing, using, and preparing emergency food.

### Choose foods that:

- have a long storage life
- require little or no cooking, water, or refrigeration, in case utilities are disrupted
- meet the needs of babies or other family members who are on special diets
- meet pets' needs
- are not very salty or spicy, as these foods increase the need for drinking water, which may be in short supply.

### **How to Store Emergency Food**

- A disaster can easily disrupt the food supply at any time, so plan to have at least a 3-day supply of food on hand
- When storing food, it is not necessary to buy dehydrated or other types of emergency food. Canned foods and dry mixes will remain fresh for about 2 years.
- Certain storage conditions can enhance the shelf life of canned or dried foods. The ideal location is a cool, dry, dark place. The best temperature is 40 to 60°F. Keep foods away from ranges or refrigerator exhausts. Heat causes many foods to spoil more quickly.
- Keep food away from petroleum products, such as gasoline, oil, paints, and solvents. Some food products absorb their smell.
- Protect food from rodents and insects. Items stored in boxes or in paper cartons will keep longer if they are heavily wrapped or stored in airtight containers.
- Date all food items. Use and replace food before it loses freshness.

### **How to Use Emergency Food**

- Use perishable food in your refrigerator or freezer before using food in your emergency supplies.
- Discard cooked, unrefrigerated foods after 2 hours at room temperature, regardless of appearance.
- Eat only foods that have a normal color, texture, and odor.
- Discard cans that bulge at the ends or that are leaking.

### **Preparing Food**

Preparing food after an earthquake may be complicated by damage to your home and loss of electricity, gas, and water. The following items will help you to prepare meals safely:

- Cooking utensils
- Knives, forks, and spoons
- Paper plates, cups, and towels
- A manual can- and bottle-openerHeavy-duty aluminum foil
- Gas or charcoal grill or camp stove and the proper fuel. (CAUTION: Never burn charcoal indoors. The fumes are deadly when concentrated indoors.)
- Do not use your fireplace for cooking until the chimney has been inspected for cracks and damage. Sparks may escape into your attic through an undetected crack and start a fire.

# **Keep Your Home Secure During the Holiday Season**

Hello Neighbors... Well... It is already November with 2023 right around the corner. November kickstarts the holiday season and all the shopping that comes with it. This is a big month for shopping, shipping and mailing. I would like to review several safety tips from the Newport Beach Police Department. I did make a few revisions and or abbreviations.

- Always lock all doors and windows whenever you leave your home.
   Burglars often operate during the day, so do not forget to secure your home and set your alarm.
- Use timers to turn on a radio and lights. Timers should be used yearly. Consider leaving a TV on for a period of time.
- Avoid displaying holiday gifts and valuable items where they will be easily seen from the outside.
- Always keep your porch lights on from dawn to dusk.
- Do not let deliveries pile up at your front door or gate. Not home for a delivery? Have a neighbor pick up the package(s) until you return home. Schedule deliveries with UPS, FedEx, Amazon, etc. Track a delivery to time the arrival.
- Speaking of neighbors. Get to know them. Make sure you have the names and phone numbers of those who live next door and across from you.
- Call the police to report anything suspicious. If you see an unfamiliar vehicle, suspicious person, or anything out of the ordinary when leaving your home, call NBPS's non-emergency line at 949-644-3717.

### Establish good habits.

- Even when you just run to the store, take the dog for a walk or go out to dinner, make sure you secure all your doors and windows and set your alarm (if you have one).
- We see early evening/dinner time hours the most common time for a burglary to occur.
- Keep up on the maintenance of your security system. Check to make sure your system is working properly and fix any issues in a timely manner.

### When you are away for the holidays.

- Do not advertise that you are out of town on your phone message or social media platforms.
- As stated above, have a trusted neighbor or friend watch your home, collect items left/delivered outside and secure your mail.
- Secure your garage door with a vacation bolt or pad lock and disable the remote access.

### Looking for security gift ideas? Here are some suggestions.

- Doorbell camera.
- Motion activated security cameras that send an immediate notification to your smart phone.
- Smart home timers, lights and lightbulbs.
- TV simulators-these devices make it look as though someone is inside watching TV.



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# Hanbon Lightz

Did you know that the Newport Beach Boat Parade started out as a summer event?

One of the highlights of the holiday season for Lido Isle residents is the glittering Newport Beach Boat Parade. But did you know that the boat parade actually was a summer tradition in Newport for many years? It is thanks to gondolier John Scarpa from Venice (California, that is) that we even have such an event. In 1908, Scarpa rowed his gondola from Venice, CA to Newport to start a Newport Harbor gondola tour. Then in August 1908, he decided to hold a small boat parade, with eight canoes and his gondola, all

lit with Japanese paper lanterns. The Tournament of Lights, as it was called, was an instant success and grew from there.

After World War I, Joe Beek of Balboa Island took the event over, and he was happy to supply the hefty number of Japanese lanterns which were now required for the parade (and Beek stored the lanterns, so they were reused again and again). Beek also used his small pedestrian ferry, the Fat Fairy, to tow some of the boats that had no power. The Tournament of Lights had gotten so successful by 1931 that California's Governor James Rolph attended the event. While in 1927 there were only twenty floats, by 1935 there were 150 floats and 100,000 spectators. Although small boats and canoes were still a big part of the parade, larger entries from Pasadena, Long Beach, Santa Barbara, Southern California Edison, the Pomona Fair and the National Orange Show in San Bernardino dominated the headlines in the Los Angeles Times, which covered the event in depth every year. The LA Metropolitan Water District float of 1937 sounded particularly magnificent, with water nymphs dancing in rainbow-colored water sprays. Before things sound too euphoric, however, Old Isle noted that one of the 1932 float entries was from the Ku Klux Klan of Orange County, although their float was not pictured!

Another fun feature of the Tournament of the Lights in the 1930s was the use of anti-aircraft searchlights from Fort MacArthur in San Pedro to cast light over the entire Newport Beach area. Sixty men were needed to operate the 5 searchlights. Some years the US Navy docked the cruisers Trenton and Marblehead off the coast, shining their own lights in a totally peacetime capacity. Southern California Edison often contributed their own lighted aircraft to fly over the area, and blimps seemed to have made an appearance some years.

The 1940s saw the Tournament of Lights cancelled for many years because of the war. When the war ended, continued crowds were the undoing of the event because emergency services were not able to operate in the overcrowded streets. Sadly, the summertime parade tradition was discontinued in 1950. But luckily in 1946, some city employees had started to decorate a Christmas tree on a barge, which was then towed around the harbor. Christmas carolers on the barge serenaded spectators on the shore. The parade tradition thus began its rebirth as a Christmas event.

The photos here show different floats in the 1930s tournaments. But what particularly caught Old Isle's eye was the Long Beach float, with its magnificent backdrop of the Lido Isle Clubhouse, changing rooms intact. When you watch the holiday boat parade this year, think back to the excitement that our Lido forebearers felt each summer, when magical Japanese lanterns took over the harbor.

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# Aligon Zomanis Amazing One Pot Roasted Chicken

For those days leading up to the busy holiday season — easy to make, impressive to serve and delectable to eat.

### Ingredients:

1 4 lb. chicken
1 Tbs canola oil
2 shallots halved lengthwise
4 sprigs thyme
Kosher salt, freshly ground pepper
1 lemon cut into thick slices, no seeds
4—6 pitted Medjool dates
1 Tbs crushed red pepper flakes

**Directions:** Preheat oven to 425°. Season chicken with salt and pepper. Heat oil in large Dutch oven over medium—high heat. Press chicken, breast up, into pot forcing even contact of skin with pot for 5-8 minutes. Add lemon slices, ensure they contact the bottom of the pot to caramelize for 2 minutes. Add shallots, dates, thyme and 2 cups of water. Sprinkle top of the chicken with crushed red pepper flakes and place lid on pot. Roast in oven for 25 mins. Remove lid and continue to cook another 25 mins. Remove from oven, let rest for 10 mins before transferring it to a cutting board and carving. Serve alongside cooking juices, shallots, lemons, and dates. Use fresh sprigs of thyme for garnish.

## Fool Proof Turkey Gravy

### Ingredients:

Yield: 5 to 6 cups
7 tbs turkey or chcken fat,
left in roasting pan
6 tbs all-purpose flour
½ cup white wine
4 to 5 cups turkey stock
Kosher salt and black pepper



**Step 1**: Pour off all but 7 or so tablespoons turkey fat from the roasting pan, and set the pan on the stovetop over medium heat. Sprinkle the flour over the fat and cook, stirring constantly, until the mixture is golden, 8 to 10 minutes.


**Step 2:** Increase heat to medium high and add a little white wine, whisking as you go to let it reduce. Slowly add stock, stirring constantly, until the mixture is smooth. Cook, continuing to stir, until the gravy has thickened, approximately 8 to 10 minutes. Season to taste with salt and pepper.

### Turkey Roasting Guide

All times given are for stuffed birds. Tent bird loosely with foil or cover breast with butter soaked cheesecloth if it browns too fast. Times are approximate. Test often for doneness at end of cooking.

Size (lbs)	Oven Temp	Cook Time (hrs)	Internal Temp When Done
4-8	325 F	1 3/4 - 2 3/4	180 - 185 F
8-12	325 F	3 ½ - 4	180 - 185 F
12-16	325 F	4 - 4 1/2	180 - 185 F
16-20	325 F	4 ½ - 5	180 - 185 F
20-24	325 F	5 - 6	180 - 185 F





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
