CERT Meeting Day Changes to Accommodate More Attendance Spring 2023 Training Events Coming Up

Lido's CERT group met on Saturday, November 12th at the clubhouse. The primary objective has been to secure block captains for the island and the group discussed progress and tactics to generate more participation and enlist block captains. The group recognized that Saturday meetings are inconvenient for many due to competing events such as family sports, sailing or other events that occur on Saturday, significantly restricting attendance. The group also recognized that the clubhouse is also often unavailable on Saturdays and will remain so as it books up for the holidays, weddings and other events. As a result, the group decided to change the meeting dates and times to make them more convenient.

Effective with December, the meetings will now take place at 6pm on alternating Tuesdays and Wednesdays as scheduled below:

Additional instruction on locating and turning off your gas meter in the event of an earthquake is also in the works.

While dates are not yet established, spring, 2023 CERT training classes are typically scheduled for mid-February to mid-March with both

weekend and weeknight classes. FEMA sponsors the training which is free for residents and employees in the city.

The CERT Program is designed to prepare you to help yourself, your family, and your neighbors in the event of a catastrophic disaster. Because emergency services personnel will not be able to help everyone immediately, you can make a difference by using CERT training to save lives and protect property.

Following a major disaster, first responders who provide fire and medical services will not be able to meet the demand for these services. Factors such as number of victims, communication failures, and road blockages will prevent people from accessing emergency services they have come to expect at a moment's notice through 911. People will have to rely on each other for help in order to meet their immediate life-saving and life sustaining needs.

CERT is about readiness, people helping people, rescuer safety, and doing the greatest good for the greatest number. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens will be initially on their own and their actions can make a difference. Through training, citizens can manage utilities and put out small fires; treat the three killers by opening airways, controlling bleeding, and treating for shock; provide basic medical aid; search for and rescue victims safely; and organize themselves and spontaneous volunteers to be effective.

Newport Beach CERT was awarded with the 2012 FEMA Individual and Community Preparedness award for Outstanding CERT program initiatives and Lido very recently received its own award for excellence in its program.

Hello Lido! This is your Troop 37 columnist, Mason Richley Alexis. I want to tell you about my upcoming Eagle Scout project which will benefit the Lido Isle community. To start, I joined Troop 37 in the spring of 2017 when I was eleven years old. In the summer of 2018, while working on my Entrepreneurship Merit Badge, I helped design the signage to locate medical supplies and heart defibrillators. As part of this project, I assessed the Lido Isle Clubhouse and its first AED (Automatic External Defibrillator), located inside the clubhouse. An easily accessible AED is an essential lifesaving device because once someone has a heart attack, there are only three to five minutes "from drop to shock." This means that finding the AED in a short amount of time may save someone's life.

That same summer, I witnessed a medical emergency where a man fell down outside the clubhouse and began bleeding profusely. The medical supply kit was inconveniently locked inside the clubhouse, but luckily, we were able to scramble and find supplies to help him before the ambulance arrived. This gave me

the idea that the Lido Isle Clubhouse needed an AED and medical supply kit mounted OUTSIDE of the clubhouse, right by the dock. In this way, if an emergency or accident occurs outside the clubhouse or even on the water, boaters and bystanders can access the outdoor AED and medical supplies, which can significantly boost the safety of our harbor.

Therefore, I propose installing an outdoor AED and medical supply station at the Lido Isle Clubhouse for my Eagle Scout project. This installation is of vital importance to our Lido Isle community because it can save lives. In order to fund this essential lifesaving project, I need to raise \$3000. We would greatly appreciate any amount you can donate to help me install our outdoor AED at the Lido Clubhouse.





The Nautical Life... Children's Reading

Many of Lido Isle's adults (including Old Isle) look rather enviously on Lido children and the idyllic island lifestyle they enjoy. Sailing, swimming and building sandcastles are a part of our everyday island activities. In Old Isle's family, we also enjoyed reading about children's island lifestyles in other places in the US and around the world. The following is a very incomplete survey of children's island and boating literature, most of it somewhat "vintage" (this is Old Isle, after all!), but all of it atmospheric and even poetic at times.

One of the best books for children of all ages is the 1958 Caldecott-medal-winner Time of Wonder. The author, Robert McCloskey, also wrote the cherished children's classic Make Way for Ducklings. Time of Wonder is special on it own merits, however, with spectacular watercolor illustrations of the Maine island region, where the story is set. You and your young reader will never forget this story of a stormy Maine at the end of the summer season. The artwork also will linger in your mind.

For children ages 3-9 or so (or again, curious adults), the Katie Morag books tell a modern-day tale of the Scottish isles, where ferries, sheep and Wellington boots are the order of the day. Not much like Lido, but a very vibrant view of life on isolated, cold and wet islands! The excellent and detailed illustrations are a great addition to the sweet stories, all by Scottish author Mairi Hedderwick.

For grade school children, ages 5-10, the "Tim" series of books by Edward Ardizzone takes readers on sea-faring adventures. Little Tim and the Brave Sea Captain was the first of the series, published in 1936. Ardizzone was a highly accomplished artist who became a gifted author, which accounts for these books staying in print for these many years.

For family reading, especially nice in front of a winter fireplace, the Swallows and Amazons books are a real treat. These are not picture books but are written for a younger

audience by Arthur Ransome (who was also a Russia scholar, strangely enough). This is a series of twelve substantial books that mostly take place in the northerly Lake District of England, namely Coniston Water and Lake Windermere. The children live an idyllic lifestyle, camping, hiking and boating, with only the occasional interference of their adults. What great fun childhood was back in the 1920s/1930s!

Because many of these books are vintage, and British (in most cases), there may be some unfamiliar concepts, so make sure to keep your phone on hand for necessary definitions and explanations which may crop up. But these meanderings can lead to some interesting conversations and learning experiences.
