WILL YOU BE PREPARED? Learn what to put inside your "Go Bag"

Are you and your family prepared for a major earthquake? From the U.S. Geological Survey, here is a list of some of the world's deadliest earthquakes since 2001:

- → June 22, 2022: In Afghanistan, more than 1,100 people die in a magnitude 6.1 earthquake.
- → Aug. 14, 2021: In Haiti, a magnitude 7.2 earthquake kills more than 2,200 people.
- → Sept. 28, 2018: A magnitude 7.5 earthquake hits Indonesia, killing more than 4,300 people.
- → April 25, 2015: In Nepal, more than 8,800 people are killed by a magnitude 7.8 earthquake.
- → March 11, 2011: A magnitude 9.0 quake off the northeast coast of Japan triggers a tsunami, killing nearly 20,000 people.
- → Jan. 12, 2010: In Haiti, a staggering 316,000 people are killed by a magnitude 7.0 quake, according to government estimates.
- → May 12, 2008: A magnitude 7.9 quake strikes Sichuan province in China, resulting in more than 87,500 deaths.
- → May 26, 2006: More than 5,700 people die when a magnitude 6.3 quake hits the Indonesian island of Java.
- → Oct. 8, 2005: A magnitude 7.6 earthquake kills more than 80,000 people in Pakistan's Kashmir region.
- → March 28, 2005: A magnitude 8.6 quake in northern Sumatra in Indonesia kills about 1,300 people.
- → Dec. 26, 2004: A magnitude 9.1 quake in Indonesia triggers an Indian Ocean tsunami, killing 230,000 people in a dozen countries.
- → Dec. 26, 2003, a magnitude 6.6 earthquake hits southeastern Iran, resulting in 50,000 deaths.
- → May 21, 2003: More than 2,200 people are killed in a magnitude 6.8 earthquake in Algeria.
- → Jan. 26, 2001: A magnitude 7.7 quake strikes Gujarat in India, killing 20,000 people.

Over the next few months we have three training session meetings that will cover different aspects of preparation for earthquake and other disasters. These will be held in the Garden Room and will start at 6pm and end by 6:45pm. These sessions include:

March 15th @ 6pm: Go Bags with Dr. Lisa Shaver, MD

(Date changed from March 8th)

What a go bag is, why you need one, where to keep it, what to put inside and why every family should have them ready. Preparing food for the go bags, what to include. The session will start promptly after 6pm. Pizza and drinks will be served starting at 5:45, but once the presentation starts food is otherwise done.

Dr. Shaver grew up on Lido and currently lives in Portland, Oregon where she has been a CERT (which is termed NET-Neighborhood Emergency Team in Portland) active volunteer since 2016. She is a naturopathic physician and licensed acupuncturist in private practice. She is a returned Peace Corps volunteer having served in the Central African Republic for 4 years, two of which she lived in the African bush with no running water or electricity.

April 11th @ 6pm: Gas Meter Shut Off

Three short instructional videos from a California fireman, a representative from The Gas Company and a plumber. A hands on display will be present for residents to practice turning off a gas meter valve. Instructional videos will cover locating your gas meter and shut off valve, the on and off positions of a valve, three indicators of a leak, how to turn off your valve off, and turning the gas back on.

May 10th @ 6pm: Home Generators for Emergency Use

An officer from LT Generators will give a presentation on home generators for home emergency use. This will include a discussion of safety, storage, noise, fuel options, maintenance, and cost considerations. They are there to provide information and education and not to sell, though you are certainly welcome to contact them after the meeting to discuss your needs.

TRISH BROWN BREAD

Ingredients: 3 ¼ Cups stone-ground wholewheat flour, ¾ Cup plain white flour, 1 tsp kosher salt, 1 tsp baking soda, 1 egg, 1 Tbs olive oil, 1 tsp honey, 1 ¾ Cup butter milk, 2 tbs sunflower seeds. Mix dry ingredients in large mixing bowl. Mix buttermilk, egg, honey and oil in another bowl.



Instructions: Preheat oven to 350 F. Rub olive oil on bottom and sides of loaf pan. Make a well in your dry ingredients and pour 1/3 of milk mixture into well. Mix gently by hand until it begins to get sticky. Add another third of the milk mixture and gently mix again. Add the last third and gently mix. Avoid overmixing or bread will come out tough! Pour into prepared loaf pan. Sprinkle top with seeds, place in middle shelf of oven. Check for doneness after 45 minutes. Cook time can vary from 45 minutes to an hour. Cool on wire rack before cutting. Serve with Kerry Gold unsalted butter and smoked salmon for a delicious appetizer, or slather with butter and jam for a lovely snack.

AN UPDATE FOR THE **New Genoa/Nord Dock**

As most of you may be aware, the Genoa Nord dock sustained serious damage when a car sped thru the Genoa Nord Park and then onto the dock system. The dock was damaged to the extent that it will need to be replaced (pier, ramp and float). The Board is working with our insurance carriers diligently to recover the loss and they in turn are working with the insurance company for the driver of the car.

So what is the current status? We now have (finally) obtained drawings and calculations from our structural engineer. We can soon submit our plans to the City for Approval in Concept (AIC). This means that we can then begin the Regulatory Path. Prior to initiating the approval process we have to get eelgrass (a protected seagrass) and caulerpa taxifolia (considered a toxic algae) studies completed. We can't submit for the eelgrass study until March 1st as the eelgrass growing season is March to October. If that goes well (4 to 6 weeks to get the reports) then we can apply to the City for the AIC. Upon approval of AIC, we can move on to the Regulatory Path.

So what is the Regulatory Path? Now we have to complete pages of documents (thank you Lisa Miller of Shellmaker) to the Army Corp of Engineers, the Regulatory Water Control Board and the dreaded Coastal Commission for approval of the project. It will take 6 to 12 months from submittal to the agencies to get the approvals. All documents are submitted to the agencies at the same time.

Once we get all the approvals we then can actually begin the removal of the old dock system and begin the building of the new dock. Reality is that we should have a new dock sometime in 2024 or early 2025.

We will keep you informed of current status as we move forward.



Caring for Lido's Historic Trees

Did you know that the four Italian Stone Pines (Pinus Pinea) Iocated at Piazza Lido are almost 80 years old?

These trees have quite a significant history on the island. Based on past aerial photos, it seems the trees were planted sometime during the

late 1940's and are quickly approaching 80 years of age. These beautiful specimens can live another 50-60 years under the right living conditions. The City of Newport Beach has offered to assist LICA to help ensure this outcome.

Recommendations made by the city's arborist include easy tasks like installing drip irrigation, putting down mulch and perhaps creating a path of a few simple step stones for pedestrians and pups to use so roots won't be trampled upon. The city has offered (at no cost to LICA) to complete the more complicated crown cleaning, tree washing, wooly aphid treatment and vertical soil aeration.

The tree washing will require some innovative thinking to meet the city's water preservation and runoff collection requirements. One idea is for the NBFD to spray the trees while doing their monthly hose-water pressure testing. They'll use their ladder to spray from above, and since the water was set to be released anyway, there's no waste. Vacuum trucks would be used to suck up and properly dispose of the dirty water that falls to the pavement.

Due to the Migratory Bird Treaty Act, trimming the trees cannot happen until after the birds who might be nesting in the branches have moved on, generally between July and January.

So, if you see activity around our "old friends" in the next few months, know that they are being treated with TLC so they can hang around for many years to come.



Cookbooks are great resources that give an interesting insight into the cultural history of a place, so it was with excitement that Old Isle recently found the 1955 work "Cooking File of Lido Isle" for sale on Ebay. The 64-page softcover book, a product of the Lido Isle Women's Club, is homespun, with typewritten pages, but also a creative flair. The cover is a simple artwork by Lido's-own Bea Riley (1925-2018), and there is an introductory poem by LIWC president at the time, Jean Tandowsky. Many of the recipes would never see the light of day in a modern cookbook, but they certainly point up the vast changes in entertaining and family cooking over the years, Lido-style. BLUSHING PEAR SALAD

1 lg. can Iris Baby Bartlett Pears
1 #2 can crushed pineapple
3 pkgs. Itme Jello
1 8 oz. pkg. Phil. cream cheese
at room temperature
1 cup mayonnaise
Drain fruit, to juice add water
to make 4 cups. Dissolve Jello in
heated liquid. Set aside 3/4 cup
to use for top. Chill remaining
Jello until thick. Beat Jello and
gradually add mayonnaise and cream
cheese. Add pineapple, pour into
pan, allow to become firm. Tint
the pears with diluted red and



cool.






Anna Flaherty Racing Program Coordinator



a Brief History of the Lido Jr. Sailing Foundation

The Lido Junior Sailing Foundation would not exist if not for LIYC Staff Commodore Marty and Amelia Lockney. Marty was an active Lido 14 sailor racing under the LIYC burgee and Amelia was active in Lido social activities. Many young Lido children got their first crewing position racing with Marty.

The Foundation was formed in 2000 with a generous endowment of \$500,000 by the Lockney Estate. Their entire estate was divided among ten charities. The Lockney Estate Attorneys notified us that the money could only be given to a "Not for Profit" entity. LIYC Commodore Mike Baginski quickly formed a committee and created the what is now the *Lido Junior Sailing Foundation*.

The foundation is a 501c(3) and is chartered to "provide support sailing, seamanship and life skills, including sportsmanship, teamwork, community service and safety, for youths and young adults in Orange County." The LJSF Board is composed of the President and four of the most recent LIYC Staff Commodores who are willing to serve.

Over the past 22 years, the Foundation has given out awards of over \$430,000. The recipients for these awards include local high school sailing teams, the Sea Scout Base in Newport Beach, charitable regattas such as the Leukemia Cup, and our own Lido Isle Junior Sailing program. The funds have been used by these organizations to purchase and maintain boats, educate instructors, and promote youth sailing in Orange County. In 2013 the Foundation purchased and modified the "Commodore Lockney," the Race Committee boat for LIYC.

While Marty and Emilia were very generous, the Foundation will someday run out of funds. Today, due to years of near zero interest rate and financial market fluctuations, the Foundation principle has gone from \$500K to \$237K. 


