LEAF BLOWERS Make sure it is electric, not gas powered!

To protect residents from nuisance and excessive levels of noise, and to promote comfort, safety, and welfare, the City of Newport Beach adopted an ordinance **prohibiting** the operation of gas-powered leaf blowers in residential neighborhoods. This ordinance does not prohibit electric leaf blowers and is enforced by the city, not LICA. To file a complaint or report a person acting in violation of the Gas-Powered Leaf Blower Ordinance, call Newport Beach Code Enforcement at (949) 644-3215.

How to Make a **Court Reservation**

- 1. For Tennis, Pickleball or Basketball court reservations go to the Lido Isle Community Association website at https://lidoisle.org/
- 2. Click on Member Login tab in upper bar and log in with your credentials.
- 3. Scroll down to Tennis/Pickleball/Basketball reservations located at bottom left hand corner, click where it says "click here."
- 4. Select location (which court), service (30, 60 or 90 minutes) and date on which you'd like to reserve, then click "Next."
- 5. Select your time slot, click "Next." (Note: If desired time slot is not available go back to select another date to make a reservation.)
- 6. Provide your name, email address and any notes you wish to provide, click "Next" to proceed with booking.
- 7. Click "Proceed to Checkout" to pay. You will need to provide a credit or debit card to use the online system.
- 8. Once paid, you will receive a confirming email at the email address you provided in step 6.
- 9. For further information see LICA Directive 5 Court Rules and Regulations, which can be viewed on the LidoIsle.org website under Governing Documents.

BOARD APPROVED POLICY/PROCEDURE DIRECTIVE

DIRECTIVE NO. 5 ADOPTED: SUPERSEDES: December 9,

2009 December 11, 2019

THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY TO ALL COURT USE EXCEPT SPECIAL PROGRAMS SANCTIONED BY THE IDO ISLE COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION ("LICA") BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- The LICA tennis courts ("Courts") are for the use of LICA Residents and their guests and Lido Isle Tennis Club ("LITC") approved functions only. A "Resident" is any LICA Member or their tenant with a current annual lease residing on Lido Isle. Courts are for all age groups.
- 2. Courts include the Barcelona Tennis Court, the Jucar Tennis Court, the Jucar Pickleball/Basketball Court, the Jucar Practice Court, and the San Remo Tennis Stadium.
- 3. Courts are for tennis, pickleball, basketball or other LICA approved play only.

POLICY: TENNIS COURT RULES AND REGULATIONS [DRAFT] Approved: 11/13/2019

- 4. Pickleball play shall be limited to the designated Jucar Pickleball/Basketball Court unless otherwise approved
- 5. Basketball play shall be limited to the designated Jucar Pickleball/Basketball Court and adjacent Jucar
- 2.6. Play Periods and Reservation Fees:
 - a. All Tennis CCourts are open for tennis play daily from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.
 - a.b. The designated Jucar Pickleball/Basketball Court is open for pickleball or basketball play
 - b.c. Court reservations are made in 30, 60 or 90-minute increments.
 - _Court use fees are determined by LICA management. Fees are listed in the LICA office, on the LICA website and within the LICA Court reservation system
 - _Authorized users may make a reservation sign up for Court use during regular office hours at the LICA office or using the authorized LICA Court reservation system currently in place. Fees must be paid at time of sign up. No refunds will be given. Rain checks are given for rainy days when
 - e.f.___Anyone playing on a Court without a reservation must immediately relinquish the Court to a person holding a reservation with LICA.
 - _Court reservations may can be made for the current week and the following week. Based upon demand and availability, users may be restricted from signing up for repetitive or back-to-back
- 3-7. No pets are allowed inside the Court enclosures at any time and for any reason. Violation will result in loss of
- 8. Courts are for tennis, pickle ball or other pre-approved court sports play only. Only tennis shoes or other nonmarking shoes are allowed on the Court. Skateboards, roller blades<u>, or</u> skates, bicycles<u>, scooters,</u> etc. are prohibited.- Amplified music is prohibited. Overly loud play and yelling is discoura
- 4.9. Use of the Courts for any purpose not sanctioned by LICA is STRICTLY PROHIBITED. Persons violating this rule will be asked to leave immediately. In the case of children, parents will be held responsible. Repea offenders will automatically lose Court privileges and be subject to a fine by LICA.
- 10. Use of Courts for Private Lessons and Instruction.

10.1.1 LICA Pro. The LICA designated Tennis Professional ("LICA Pro"), under contract with LICA, will be available to Residents and their guests for individual tennis instruction, clinics and classes at published times and fee schedule. Only the LICA Pro may advertise, through the Lido Islander only, the availability of the above services to be held on LICA Courts.

10.1.2 Other. PAny private instruction for tennis, pickleball, basketball or other LICA sanctioned use by anyone other than the LICA Pro shall comply with the following. be as follows

Reservations. Other than the LICA Ppro, only a Lido Isle resident in good standing may secure a court reservation.

Maximum number of Students.

i. Private instructors may instruct no more than one (1) individual at one time; such individual

b.ii. No clinics may be held by a private instructor. A clinic is defined as providing instruction to more than one (1) individual at any one time as part of a group.

i. Proof of Professional Certification. Private instructors for tennis and pickleball must be

- Certified Professionals. A Certified Tennis Pro is defined as a tennis instructor who is a member of the US Professional Tennis Association (USPTA). A Certified Pickleball Pro is defined as a tennis instructor who is a member of the US Professional Tennis Association
- ii. Insurance. Private instructors who wish to provide tennis, pickleball or basketball instruction o LICA: A Certificate of Insurance (COI) naming Lido Isle Community Association as an additionally insured with a minimum of \$1,000,000 coverage
- c. A Certified Pro is defined as a tennis instructor who is a member of the US Professional Tennis Association
- 11. Residents who have had their LICA membership privileges suspended following written notice and an opportunity for a hearing before the LICA Board of Directors because of unpaid LICA fees, assessments, boat storage fees, noncompliance with LICA's CC&Rs or rules and regulations, are not eligible to reserve or use the tennis courts until membership privileges have been reinstated.

Fashionable Lido

In previous Old Isle columns, we have covered Lido Isle-based fashion designer Dorothy O'Hara, who lived on Via Eboli. Old Isle recently came across another Lido Isle link to the fashion industry: Georgia Bullock (1918-1991). Georgia's longevity in the fashion industry was incredible, stretching from the 1940s until at the least the early 1970s. As with O'Hara, her designs were sold in the finest stores and featured in prominent magazines such as Vogue and Harper's Bazaar. Bullock's clothes were photographed by luminaries such as Richard Avedon and Norman Parkinson. Supermodels of the time Suzy Parker and Wilhelmina modelled Bullock's fashions.

Georgia's story started with her childhood in East Whittier, CA where she made clothes for her dolls. After an education at USC, she furthered her studies in the design world at Frank Wiggins Trade School (now LA Trade Tech). Georgia entered the design world and opened her own brand at the age of 28, using the brand names Miss Georgia, Barefoot Fashions and Barefoot Dress. In a 1947 Los Angeles Times fashion column, Georgia was described as "diminutive Georgia Bullock, who looks about 14 and is one of the most talented designers in the business" and "deserving far more credit than limited space permits."

Georgia's Lido Isle history came in the in the late 1950s. Georgia had earlier married a Jack Dunbar, and they had two children, Scot and Sandal. The family's main residence seemed to be in Beverly Hills, and an LA Times column in 1958 noted that, "Cute Dorothy Bullock Dunbar, back from a quickie trip to Mexico City, has moved into the Sheraton-West while her newly purchased home in B. Hills is remodeled into Mexican modern. Understand it's a transformation from a Spanish house." However, Georgia's residence on Lido Isle is noted in a later 1959 Times column which stated that, "Mrs. Dunbar will take her children, Sandal and Scot, to Lido Isle this summer for a six-week holiday." Georgia's "Oriental Party" on Lido that summer was reported as having continued "into the wee hours of the morning".

A fall 1959 Georgia Bullock-sponsored fashion show on Lido, under the auspices of the Lido Isle Women's Club, cited both Georgia and her sister/assistant Annette Bullock Crum as Lido "residents". Old Isle has not

been able to ascertain an address for Georgia but is working on it! Whether Georgia was a full-time resident on Lido is not sure, but she surely was a prominent part of Lido society for a time. In the early 1960s, she apparently bought a property in Malibu, and had moved to a Paul Williams-designed house in Holmby Hills (after a "house-cooling" party to say goodbye to her Beverly Hills home), and her connections to Lido Isle seemed to be over.

Georgia's designs are worth searching out online. Old Isle found the 1960s designs to be especially timeless. Do you know of any more Lido links to the fashion world? Email Old Isle at masonlido@gmail.com.



Greetings Lido community! These past few months have been busy ones, and I'm pleased to bring you a few updates on projects and issues that impact Lido and the larger West Newport community.

In January I proudly represented our city in Washington, D.C., along with Public Works Director Dave Webb, to discuss issues affecting Newport's beaches and harbors and advocate for additional funding. Many coastal projects fall under the jurisdiction of the federal government through the Army Corps of Engineers and are budgeted at the federal level.

The trip focused on coastal resiliency, including harbor dredging, sand replenishment, and bolstering anti-sand erosion projects. We met with our own representatives as well as those from other Orange County coastal communities, along with officials from the Environmental Protection Agency, Senate Appropriations Subcommittee on Energy and Water, the Army Corps, and others.

I will stay engaged in the City's ongoing effort to educate and engage national leaders on the issues affecting Newport Beach, and advocate for more federal efforts and funding toward these critical issues.

This fall the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers began work on a major project to replenishing beach sand from Seal Beach to Newport Beach. Crews deposited about 800,000 cubic yards of sand in the Sunset Beach area, of an eventual 1.2 million cubic yards that will move south over the next few years through natural wave and tidal flow. As part of the project, the Army Corps moved 100,000 cubic yards of sand from the Santa Ana River area to replenish beaches between 52nd and 36th streets. You can already see the difference, and the City's recreation department has been able to restore several beach volleyball courts that had been lost to sand erosion.

I have begun working with City Council colleagues as part of a public safety technology committee to ensure that the Newport Beach Police Department is equipped with the latest technology to further improve their crime prevention and investigative tools. These improvements could include utilizing drones, license plate readers and other equipment to help protect the community.

Speaking of public safety, I encourage you to sign up for Newport Notified, the new communication system recently launched by the NBPD. The new system alerts subscribers to emergencies and other community safety issues such as traffic and crime advisories. For more information on the new system and to sign up, please visit nbpd.org/notified.

I am also serving on a newly created City Council committee to envision new uses and potential development for Lower Castaways Park. I look forward to an eventual revitalization of this underutilized historic

On the infrastructure front, there is plenty of progress to report.

Construction of the Superior Avenue pedestrian and bicycle bridge at Pacific Coast Highway is nearly complete. The last major step -- pouring concrete for the arch that spans Superior Avenue -- was finished in January, using about 253,000 pounds of reinforced steel and about 60 truckloads of concrete.

The bridge itself is expected to be finished by March, with the remainder of the project (retaining walls, storm drains, parking lot and landscape improvements) completed by August. The \$14.7 million project will provide a significant community benefit, with improved safety for pedestrians and bicyclists across a busy intersection, and increased accessibility and use of Sunset Ridge Park through the expanded parking

This spring we will be celebrating the grand opening of the Junior Lifequard Headquarters, a public-private partnership with the Newport Beach Junior Lifeguard Foundation. The event will be open to the public; please check the City's website at www.newportbeachca.gov in early April for details.

Construction continues on the Newport Bay Trash Interceptor that will eventually capture 80 percent of trash entering Newport Bay from San Diego Creek (estimated at 100-500 tons a year). The trash interceptor – which collects trash floating downstream before it can pollute the bay, harbor and beaches – will be operational later this year.

The Peninsula area is still experiencing too many power outages. Please know that I am continuing to work closely with Southern California Edison on plans to improve power reliability to Lido and other West Newport neighborhoods. While the City of Newport Beach is not a power supplier, I have been engaged in discussions with SCE about potential solutions that could be pursued in the future and will update you as those projects

Lastly, I am energized by the progress of restoration on the historic Lido Theater, and I look forward to seeing the final results of the improvements



YOUNG SAILORS (~5-6YRS OLD)

Starfish – For sailors turning 5 this year who have completed a Pre-K program and are ready to start their sailing adventure with an introduction to sailing that gets them comfortable in and around the water. No boat necessary!

Sea Urchin – For sailors who have completed Kindergarten and are ready to start learning the basic concepts of sailing such as parts of the boat and how to identify wind direction. No boat necessary!

NON-RACING CLASSES

Novice - For first-time or beginner sailors to learn the parts of the boat, basic rigging, knots and basic sailing skills such as steering and sail trim. These sailors may not have the confidence to sail independently right away but independent sailing is the ultimate goal of this program. Limited charter boats available!

Advanced Beginner (Pre C-3) – For beginner sailors who are confident sailing independently but are not quite ready for regattas or are not interested in racing. This class will work on fine-tuning basic sailing skills and will introduce sailors to the concept of racing in a no-pressure environment. Naples Sabot required.

Junior Mariners (Ages 11+) – A group for older sailors who may not have learned at an earlier age or those that have learned but do not have an interest in racing. This class will continue to hone sailing skills in a fun, non-competitive environment and allow the sailor to pursue a lifetime of enjoyment in the sport. No boat required!






Phase 2: Clubhouse **Remodel Update**



Our next event will be a feast from Zabb Thai Cuisine at the Clubhouse on April 15 (moved out one week due to Easter).





Sovering Spring's Bounty Ricotta Stuffed Squash Blossoms

Ingredients:

6 oz ricotta; 2 oz grated mozzarella; 2 TBS chopped chives; kosher salt, freshly ground pepper; 8 squash blossoms, stamens removed; 1 C plain dry breadcrumbs; 2 large eggs; ¼ C olive oil.

Instructions:

Mix ricotta, mozzarella, and chives; season with salt and pepper. Transfer to a piping bag or resealable plastic bag (cut tip). Pipe into squash blossoms. Place breadcrumbs in a baking dish. Lightly beat eggs in another dish. Heat oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Dip blossoms in egg, then breadcrumbs. Cook, turning once, until golden, about 4 minutes. Drain on paper towels; season with salt.
