### 2024 LICA Board Election

# The Results Are In...

The ballots have been tallied and the election results are in. Thank you to all who voted. The original election meeting for 2024 was April 13th but not enough ballots had been received by then to meet quorum so the ballots could not be counted. Per current LICA procedures, 51% of the membership (you the property owners) must submit a ballot to meet quorum. Ballots may not be counted until such quorum is met. A second election meeting was scheduled for May 7th, but quorum was not reached by that date either. A third meeting was scheduled for May 29th. In the meantime, email blasts were sent to the community, phone calls were made, and neighbors talked to neighbors to encourage property owners who had not yet voted to VOTE. FINALLY, 47 days after the regularly scheduled Annual Election Meeting, enough ballots had been received to meet quorum!

Accurate Voting Services, a third-party Inspector of Elections hired by LICA, ran the election and counted the ballots. On May 29, 2024, it was confirmed that 456 ballots representing 51% of the membership in the Lido Isle Community Association were present in person or by ballot.

Thank you to all who were willing to "throw their hat in the ring" to serve this amazing community that we all share.

# Introducing the **2024 LICA Board of Directors**

Best wishes to the 2024 LICA Board as they undertake their fiduciary responsibilities as elected members.

LICA's new board was seated on May 29, 2024. Immediately after the vote was announced the directors (that's what the board members are called) got to work and elected Alastair Fraser as President, David Hendler as Vice-President, Ronda Clark as Secretary and Bill Kroener as Treasurer. The first full board meeting was held on June 12th and was kicked off by a presentation from LICA attorney, David Cane. Mr. Cane reviewed the Directors' fiduciary duties, LICA policies and procedures and applicable state law. One of the new state laws impacting HOA management is Assembly Bill 1458. The bill addresses the struggle that many HOAs face in achieving election quorums. (See page 2 for more details on the new law.)

Committee and club liaison positions were also assigned at the June 12 meeting. Sometimes it is easy to forget that the LICA Board is all-volunteer, and the time commitment goes far beyond the monthly meetings. Every director happily stepped up to take on a variety of roles and responsibilities, a testament to the strong community bond that Lido Isle engenders. See the side-bar on page 2 for assigned committees

The Board will have a busy docket in 2024 with some special issues in addition to its regular duties (and who knows what surprises!). A big task will be the renewal of LICA's 25-year lease with the city that covers LICA's end parks and the Antibes boat yard. The current lease signed in 2000 will expire in April 2025. Bringing the Reserve Study, projected facility needs and annual budget into alignment with the reality of inflation will also be a big focus. Additionally, the board has identified communication with the community as a top priority. Look for improvements to LICA's web portal and future articles on these and other LICA matters in the *Islander*.

- Updating the Architectural Guidelines with inclusion of focus to minimize negative impacts from construction work on Lido residents.
- Renewing the 25-year lease agreement with the City of Newport Beach for end parks, Antibes marine facility and other areas.

# New HOA Regulations for **Election Meeting Quorum**

LICA's need to extend the election voting deadline three times and by 47 days to meet guorum is not a problem unique to Lido Isle – and this isn't the first time it has happened here. HOAs often struggle to attain "quorum," meaning the minimum member participation needed to conduct board elections. Assembly Bill 1458 was signed into law by Governor Newsom in October 2023 to provide relief to HOAs in this regard. The new law allows California HOAs to reduce their board election membership quorum to 20% on the second attempt, starting Jan. 1, 2024. This streamlined process was not used in LICAs recent election but may be implemented for LICA's elections moving forward.

It should be noted that if the HOA has complied with Civil Code Section 5103 regarding elections by acclamation and if there are not more candidates than open seats, the quorum process is unnecessary because in that circumstance the board can simply declare the candidates elected. Quorum for other HOA elections (assessments, amendments, recalls, etc.) is unchanged by this new law. The decrease in quorum applies only to board elections (and not director removal elections).

Further discussion and community input will be considered by the board before any changes to LICA's current election quorum procedures are made.



A reminder to all LICA Beach, Pier and Dock

Per Directive 7, the following rules for use are in effect for your safety and enjoyment.

- Minors under 14 years old should be accompanied by an adult
- Parents/Caregivers are solely responsible for the conduct and safety of their children and/or guests while using the common areas
- Paddleboards and kayaks may be launched at the east side of the LICA

### **Prohibited:**

- Glass containers
- Dogs (even if on leash)
- School or large group events without prior LICA approval
- Climbing on or jumping from glass patio deck railing
- Jumping or diving from docks
- Bicycles, skateboards, scooters or wheeled toys of any kind
- Throwing frisbees or balls on beach when crowded
- Swimming outside of swim lines, under floats, under swim buoys and around docks
- Throwing sand or water balloons
- Storage overnight of beach gear, paddleboards, kayaks etc.






# How to Celebrate the 4th of July, Lido Style

# Close Call at Via Lido **Nord/Antibes** Crosswalk

On Saturday, June 1 at about 10 am, a woman crossing the street at the Nord/Antibes crosswalk was nearly struck by a vehicle that is alleged to have not made a complete stop at the Stop sign as it was heading on Via Lido Nord toward Lido Village.

According to by-standers, the woman appeared to be about 60 years old and is not a resident of Lido Isle. Neighbors came out

when they heard sirens and saw the woman on the ground being tended to by paramedics. The woman alleged that the vehicle "rolled" through the stop sign, "clipped" her and knocked her down in the crosswalk. The driver stopped to assist the pedestrian and claimed that their "vehicle did not touch the woman. The NB Fire Department call dashboard indicates a "medical call to service. The NB Police Department was on scene, but the police call dashboard does not list an incident in this location on this date. It is not known if the driver was cited. By-standers described the woman as wobbly when helped up by the paramedics and visibly shaken. The paramedics bandaged a wound she sustained on her leg. It appeared that the woman was released at the scene and was not transported to a hospital

This close call could have been much worse and is a good reminder for drivers on Lido to slow down and always come to a complete stop at Stop signs. The speed limit on Lido Isle is 25 Miles Per Hour. However, this is a MAXIMUM limit. It often makes sense to drive slower, especially when children, pedestrians and bike riders are present.

# **Board Approves Directive 25 Updates:** San Remo Park

Good news Lido Families, in addition to the previously approved Monday-Friday reservation policy, residents may now reserve San Remo Park for limited private events on weekends as well. Contact the LICA Management office to make a reservation.

- A maximum of one private reservation Monday-Friday, and a maximum of one private reservation per weekend (Saturday or Sunday) is permitted.
- When San Remo Park is reserved for private use, the Main Grass Area and the Play Structure Area must remain open for use by
- Reservation hours for private events are limited to a four-hour maximum, 9 am to dusk, including set-up and breakdown.
- A non-refundable reservation fee of \$150 and a \$500 refundable deposit is required to make a reservation.
- All other aspects of Directive 25 remain remain as is.



### Dear Members,



### **GENERAL SESSION ITEMS**

Civil Code § 4925. Open Meetings; Open Forum

(a) Any member may attend board meetings, except when the board adjourns to, or meets solely in, executive session. As specified in subdivision (b) of Section 4090, a member of the association shall be entitled to attend a teleconference meeting or the portion of a teleconference meeting that is open to members, and that meeting, or portion of the meeting shall be audible to the members in a location specified in the notice of the meeting. You can purchase fennel pollen online

at Amazon or specialty food shops.

Harvested from the tiny blossoms at the end of the stalk of the fennel plant, fennel pollen is native to the Mediterranean but primarily comes from California in the U.S. The plants germinate naturally then the pollen is harvested by hand, dried and sold in little jars or packets. The pollen is the most potent form of the plant and a little goes a long way.

At first taste, fennel pollen is anise-like and earthy, then it transforms into a citrusy, sweet finish. Use it sparingly at first to prevent it from becoming too perfumy. A good rule of thumb is a ½ teaspoon per recipe to start, then add it pinch by pinch until the taste comes through to satisfaction.

Fennel pollen tastes great on just about everything - beef, poultry, fish, vegetables, even baking dishes. Rub it on your steaks along with some salt and pepper a few hours before grilling to elevate the flavor of the beef.
