



Directive 25: **Rules for the Use** of the San Remo Park

Dear Community Member(s),

In accordance with California Civil Code Section § 4360, the Board of Directors hereby provides you twenty-eight (28) day notice of proposed rules change under consideration.

The purpose of the changes is to make the Common Area amenities more accessible to residents. Furthermore, it is to maintain and foster a unique sense of community in support of the Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions of the Lido Isle Community Association. These rules cover the use, occupancy, and enjoyment thereof, all for the purpose of enhancing and protecting the value, desirability, and attractiveness of the properties within the Association.

Adopted April 2024

- Pickleball is permitted on the Jucar Basketball/Pickleball Court only. Hours: 8am-6pm, Daily.
- **Basketball** is permitted on the Jucar Basketball/Pickleball Court and Jucar Practice Area. Hours: 8am-6pm, Daily.
- **Tennis** is permitted on the Barcelona, Jucar and San Remo Tennis Courts. Hours: 7am-10pm, Daily.
- No pets at any time on courts or within gated court areas.
- The courts are for residents and their hosted guests only. Group lessons, clinics and team practices are not permitted. Reservations can be made through the online reservation system or onsite management office. Directive 5 can be viewed in its entirety online at **lidoisle.org** or contact onsite management for а сору.

Recap of Proposed Changes San Remo Park Private Event Reservations

EXISTING RULES FOR SAN REMO PARK PRIVATE EVENTS

- One private event reservation per week is permitted, Monday Friday only.
- No private event reservations are permitted on weekends (Saturdays-Sundays).
- Reservation hours for private events are limited to 10 am to Dusk, including set-up and breakdown.
- A non-refundable reservation fee of \$250 per event is required.

PROPOSED CHANGES

- Allows up to two private reservations per week.
- A maximum of one private reservation Monday-Friday is permitted, and a maximum of one private reservation per weekend (Saturday or Sunday) is
- When San Remo Park is reserved for private use, the Main Grass Area and the Play Structure Area must remain open for use by other residents.
- Reservation hours for private events are limited to 9 am to Dusk, including set-up and breakdown.
- A non-refundable reservation fee of \$150 per event is required.
- All other aspects of Directive 25 remain as is.

BOARD APPROVED POLICY/PROCEDURE

DIRECTIVE NO. 25 APPROVED: MAY 12, 2021 SUPERSEDES: February 11, 2013

POLICY: RULES FOR THE USE OF THE SAN REMO PARK

San Remo Park is a common area park for all Residents to enjoy. Limited private event requests must be made through the management office. Reservations for Park use are limited to the hours Monday Friday between 910 AM – Dusk , unless otherwise approved by the LICA Board . A maximum of two (2) private events per week is permitted – one (1) event M-F and one (1) event Saturdays and Sundays One (1) event per week is permitted with 30 guests — with a four (4) hour time limit. No private events may be held on — Holidays approved by the Association Manager or the Board of Directors. Depending upon the type of event APPROVED, certificates of insurance (COI) naming LICA as additional insured may be required. than 30 guests per private event permitted

SECURITY/CLEANING DEPOSIT: A \$500 SECURITY/CLEANING DEPOSIT IS REQUIRED AT THE TIME OF RESERVATION. ANY CLEANUP OR REPAIRS WILL BE DEDUCTED FROM THE DEPOSIT. ANY INFRACTION OF THE RULES WILL RESULT IN THE LOSS OF THE DEPOSIT.

PRIVATE EVENTS REQUIRE A NON-REFUNDABLE FEE OF \$150.

RULES FOR PARK

- Only 1 BOUNCE HOUSE is permitted per event, All outside vendors, i.e. Caterers and Bounce Houses, require a Certificate of Insurance (COI) naming LICA as additional insured with permission from the Association General Manager or Board of Directors
- NO live animals are permitted in Park without permission from the Board of Directors. DOGS ARE EVER PERMITTED IN THE AREA, EXCEPT FOR REGISTERED SERVICE
- Please use provided trash receptacles. DO NOT leave trash on ground inside or outside the Park. Additional trash bags must be deposited in the Clubhouse dumpster before departure. Any additional cleanup required will be deducted from the security deposit
- NO restrooms at Park. Use of the outside clubhouse beach restrooms is available for events
- NO weddings, no non-profit organizations, no school events, no camps or any organized

Please be sure to remove all trash, decorations, balloons, stickers, etc. NO confetti, silly

- string, water balloons, or chalk. If damage is caused to BBO, picnic tables, play equipment, fencing, irrigation, CERT shed or grass while using Park; Resident will be responsible for costs to repair or forfeit security
- Park is reserved for private use the play structure and grass area shall
- 8.9. Minors 11 and under MUST be accompanied by an adult at all times.

How to Make a Court Reservation

- 1. For Tennis, Pickleball or Basketball court reservations go to the Lido Isle Community Association website at https://lidoisle.org/.
- 2. Click on Member Login tab in upper bar and log in with your credentials.
- 3. Scroll down to Tennis/Pickleball/Basketball reservations located at bottom left hand corner, click where it says: "Click Here."
- Select location (which court), service (30, 60 or 90 minutes) and date on which you'd like to reserve, then click "Next."
- Select your time slot, click "Next." (Note: If desired time slot is not available go back 6. Provide your name, email address and any notes you wish to provide, click "Next" to
- proceed with booking. 7. Click "Proceed to Checkout" to pay. You will need to provide a credit or debit card to use the online system.
- 8. Once paid, you will receive a confirming email at the email address you provided in
- step 6. This email will also include instructions to cancel, if needed.

Via Graziana's Day in the Sun

As part of our VERY sporadic Lido Isle Street-by-Street feature, we will take a look at one of our more petite streets, consisting of only ten houses: Via Graziana. Via Graziana was to be a part of the contemplated Lido Isle Village, the commercial area planned on Lido Isle by the original developers. Via Graziana was determined to be an "income block", which is not defined. The actual businesses on Via Genoa would have had their back entrances facing onto Via Graziana, as shown by the map of the time printed here. As Old Isle has written before, this commercial development idea was seemingly determined to be unfeasible with terrible economic conditions in the 1930s. Despite this somewhat confusing start in its life, Via Graziana has been home to some distinguished residents.

Our first prominent Via Graziana resident is Wally Gerhardt, who resided at 234. Wally, as you may remember, is a well-known local photographer, whose photos have been invaluable to many Old Isle articles. His collection of area photos is housed in the UC Irvine Library and numbers over 1400 images. The images, for the most part, date from the 1940s to the 1960s. Wally took photos of Lido Isle and the local area, but he also took photos of surrounding desert areas, and farflung destinations such as Nicaragua, for which he seems to have had a particular interest. It appears that Wally worked for a local real estate agent in taking shots of homes for sale, but unfortunately, none of those photos have locations noted on them! Still, they are an interesting study of how people lived in the "old days".

At the other end of Via Graziana was Armen Sivlasian at number 206. Armen had a background as a B-29 bomber pilot in WWII and was later employed as an engineering designer for Rockwell International in Anaheim. A December 1977 article in the Los Angeles Times wrote of how Armen, age 58 at the time, was building an airplane in his garage, with attendant riveting noise, as detailed by Armen's patient wife, Mary. Once the wings were attached to the plane, Armen planned to have the plane towed to a new location where finish work would continue for another year. Although Armen had not flown since the war, he was planning to renew his pilot's license to fly the plane upon completion, although Old Isle has no information as to whether the plane ever got airborne!

Old Isle had to go a little further afield to finish this article, namely to the vicinity of Via Havre and Via Lido Soud, not too far from Via Graziana. A January 1952 Los Angeles Times article noted that actress Lana Turner and her husband Henry J. Topping were sued for \$1600 for nonpayment of rent on and damage to a Lido Isle apartment at 429 Via Lido Soud. The lawsuit stated that the couple had damaged walls and carpet of the apartment and had taken some personal property. The article notes that Lana and her husband had separated, which may have had some impact on the state of the apartment. No other information is known on this, but Turner was certainly at the height of her career during the time of her residence




