A Message from the President Alastair Fraser



It seems that Summer on Lido Isle is off to a fantastic start with another successful July 4th All Island Parade and Beach BBQ. Finally, we can say that we are getting away from May gray and June gloom and the sun and breeze have come out on multiple days in a row!

Hopefully, many of you will have seen that work has commenced on the Genoa Nord dock replacement. This is a great step forward and the expected completion, as currently scheduled, is during September.

We have also made excellent progress on the Clubhouse exterior and Boardroom update projects. LIYC and the Summer Sailing Program are using the remodeled Boardroom daily for their program. Once the sailing program is finished, we will be able to complete the Boardroom remodel with the longer-term objective being to offer this space for meetings, dinner parties and other small private events that will generate additional revenue for Lido Isle. We have already received positive feedback on the exterior improvements to the Clubhouse. Not only are these aesthetically pleasing, they are also necessary to ensure that the facilities are protected and to minimize increased maintenance costs. This project is scheduled to close out in August 2024.

We have awarded and started the Landscape Master Plan project that will define the options & strategy for the end parks and other common areas for the next 5 years or more

We continue to address immediate maintenance needs and repairs on an ongoing basis and had to replace the refrigerator and freezer in the kitchen. In collaboration with LITC, we also upgraded the Pickleball net and support structure in time for the busy July events.

Please Keep the **Gates Closed**

A friendly reminder to keep the gates at the parks and tennis courts closed at all times. LICA facilities are private property and are for the enjoyment of Lido Isle residents and their quests. Keeping the gates closed helps to minimize vandalism and misuse.

Please use your key fob provided by LICA for access. Replacement key fobs, if needed, can be obtained through LICA's onsite management office.

- → Do not give or loan your LICA facility key fob to non-residents.
- → Do not leave gates propped open at any time.
- → The San Remo Park gates to the grass area are open daily but locked at dusk through 6am.
- → The San Remo Tot Lot gate is locked at all times.
- → The Barcelona, Jucar and San Remo tennis court gates are locked at all times.
- → The Antibes Boat Yard gate is locked at all times.







In 1974, Bill Storm was perusing the L.A. Times when he happened upon an ad for a charming "summer home" on Lido Isle, for sale by owner. Having vacationed on Balboa Island for many years, the Storms were considering a move from L.A. and were looking for a neighborhood feel for their family of four. They were familiar with Lido and by June 1st, the Storms were ready to move into their home on Quito. Built in 1931, the house had three bedrooms, a front door off the Strada, and a stairwell so small they couldn't fit the beds upstairs, but they had found their place on Lido Isle. The next 15 years were spent working and raising their two boys, Tim and Scott, while they planned to build their dream house. At last, they threw a rousing demo party and the walls came down. After just six short months, they were able to move into their new home - a place that would become a true expression of who they are and this special island they call home.



Lido Isle was one of the earliest communities in the US to install underground utilities. This was done in 1928 at a cost of \$1,000,000, no small change given that the island itself had just changed hands for \$2,000,000 in a sale to William future homeowners the blight and inconvenience of power poles!

The land area of Lido Isle is 108 acres (LA Times, 4/22/1928)...or 114 acres (LA Times 1/22/1930). Take your pick!


The manager of the Lido Isle Community Association during the 1950s was a gentleman named Bunster Creely. Creely was originally a man of letters, operating the esteemed Abbey Bookstore at 629 W. Sixth St. in downtown Los Angeles for years. As well as later operating the "The Bookshop" on Balboa Island, he was the founding manager of the Orange Coast College Bookstore. He was also the founding editor our own Lido Islander in 1954. Creely was popular on the local lecture circuit, giving a presentation to the Lido Isle Women's Club in 1969 on the "History of Lido Isle" (Old Isle wishes that one was on video!). Creely was a wordsmith, and he is quoted in the 1948 LA Times as saying 'The Newport Harbor area is not another beach resort. It is an all-year marine carnival, unlike any other seaside town between Seattle and Acapulco...The waters of Newport inspire activity...The voices of things being done are the sounds of Newport."





Are You Ready for an Earthquake?

Here's what you can do to prepare for such an emergency

Prepare a Home Earthquake Plan

- Choose a safe place in every room-under a sturdy table or desk or against an inside wall where nothing can fall on you.
- ✓ Practice DROP, COVER, AND HOLD ON at least twice a year. Drop under a sturdy desk or table, hold on, and protect your eyes by pressing your face against your arm. If there's no table or desk nearby, sit on the floor against an interior wall away from windows, bookcases, or tall furniture that could fall on you. Teach children to DROP, COVER,
- Choose an out-of-town family
- Consult a professional to find out additional ways you can protect your home, such as bolting the house to its foundation and other structural mitigation techniques.
- ✓ Take a first aid class from your local Red Cross chapter. Keep
- fire extinguisher from your local
- ✓ Inform babysitters and caregivers

Eliminate hazards, by-

- cabinets, and other tall furniture to wall studs.
- ✓ Strapping the water heater
- ✓ If you are in a car, slow down and drive to a clear place (as described above). Stay in the car until the

Prepare a Disaster Supplies Kit for home and car, including-

- ✓ First aid kit and essential
- Canned food and can opener. ✓ At least three gallons of water

- ✓ Protective clothing, rainwear, and bedding or sleeping bags.
- Battery-powered radio, flashlight, and extra batteries.
- ✓ Special items for infant, elderly. or disabled family members.
- ✓ Written instructions for how to turn off gas, electricity, and water if authorities advise you to do so. (Remember, you'll need a professional to turn natural gas service back on.)
- Keeping essentials, such as a flashlight and sturdy shoes, by your bedside.

Know what to do when the shaking begins

- ✓ DROP, COVER, AND HOLD ON! Move only a few steps to a nearby safe place. Stay indoors until the shaking stops and you're sure it's safe to exit. Stay away from windows. In a high-rise building, expect the fire alarms and sprinklers to go off during a quake.
- If you are in bed, hold on and stay there, protecting your head with a pillow.

Identify what to do after the shaking stops

- Check yourself for injuries. Protect yourself from further danger by putting on long pants, a longsleeved shirt, sturdy shoes, and work gloves.
- Check others for injuries. Give first aid for serious injuries.
- Look for and extinguish small fires. Eliminate fire hazards. Turn off the gas if you smell gas or think it's leaking. (Remember, only a professional should turn it back on.)
- Listen to the radio for instructions.
- Expect aftershocks. Each time you feel one, DROP, COVER, AND HOLD ON!
- Inspect your home for damage. Get everyone out if your home is unsafe.
- Use the telephone only to report life-threatening emergencies.




