DIRECTIVE 6 REVISIONS

"You asked, we have responded"

The mission of The Architectural Review Committee (ARC) is to ensure a pleasing and agreeable environment for all Lido Isle residents. There is a specific process that homeowners are required to follow prior to making landscape or external modifications. Guidelines for plan approval are listed in the CC&Rs and Directive 6, and are also summarized in the Architectural Application Package. The LICA ARC step is in addition to any City or Coastal Commission requirements.

After the requiesite community review and response period, updates to Directive 6 were formally adopted at the August 14 LICA Board meeting. The directive was reviewed to enhance clarity of the existing rules, but with an average of 80 homes under construction or renovation on Lido Isle at any given time, we also wanted to address recurring issues caused by construction/renovation. The most pressing issues are non-approved exterior modifications and construction noise and traffic.

It is to everyone's benefit to submit their plans for ARC review and get approval prior to starting an exterior project. Paying the application fees does not automatically grant the homeowner approval. The fees are to pay for outside consultants (who recommend approval or denial) to review submitted plans for adherence to Directive 6 guidelines. Unfortunately, there are currently a substantial number of properties on Lido Isle where projects are moving forward without ARC approval. While the community prefers working with the homeowner to solve issues and avoid penalties, ignoring community guidelines can result in substantial fines.

Included in the Directive 6 update is a requirement where homeowners must make their contractors and subcontractors aware that they must be in compliance with LICA and City requirements, including nuisance avoidance and abatement. More specifically, vehicles must clearly display project details and contact phone numbers to ensure a prompt response if needed. Homeowners and General Contractors are also required to notify and get City permission with a paid permit in advance if construction work will block the road.


The procedure to obtain ARC approval is as follows:


- Collect an Architectural package from the LICA office.
- Submit your plans and application fees to ARC 1 week in advance of a meeting (first and third Monday of each month)
- Get ARC approval for minor work that does not need City approval

Get ARC preliminary approval pending City approval

o Submit to the City and get City approvals (Plan Check, Permit issue) o Return to ARC with City approved plans and obtain ARC final approval to proceed PRIOR TO COMMENCING WORK

This process is in addition to and complementary to any City of Newport Beach or Coastal Commission requirements.



CERT is People Helping People

Fall CERT Classes Offered by the Newport Beach Fire Department

The CERT Program is designed to prepare you to help yourself, your family, and your neighbors in the event of a catastrophic disaster. Because emergency services personnel will not be able to help everyone immediately, you can make a difference by using CERT training to save lives and protect property.

Following a major disaster, first responders who provide fire and medical services will not be able to meet the demand for these services. Factors such as number of victims, communication failures, and road blockages will prevent people from accessing emergency services they have come to expect at a moment's notice through 911. People will have to rely on each other for help in order to meet their immediate life saving and life sustaining needs.

CERT is about readiness, people helping people, rescuer safety, and doing the greatest good for the greatest number. CERT is a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens will be initially on their own and their actions can make a difference. Through training, citizens can manage utilities and put out small fires; treat the three killers by opening airways, controlling bleeding, and treating for shock; provide basic medical aid; search for and rescue victims safely; and organize themselves and spontaneous volunteers to be effective.

The Company that Built an Island

Early Lido Isle history is complex. Ownership of the mudflat that would become Lido Isle changed hands a number of times. Someday Old Isle might have the energy to definitively unwind this complex timeline. But the true beginnings of Lido were in 1923, when dredging began, turning the mudflat into useful property. The owner of the area at the time, W.K. Parkinson, was envisioning that the island would become industrial, as so much of Newport Harbor was at the time, with "railroad spurs, wharves and factories". However, in 1928, the island was sold to San Francisco "capitalist", William Crittenden, and plans changed radically. Development of a residential island with strong aesthetic styling, as determined by a jury of prominent LA architects, started at warp speed.

By the middle of 1928, early buildings had already gone up on Lido, including the Lido Isle Clubhouse, as envisioned by Hollywood designer Harry McAfee. But as architecture continued apace, many of the practical necessities needed for the new Lido Isle community were not yet in place. It wasn't until 1930 that things like the Lido Bridge, roads, curbs, sewers and underground utilities finally got financial backing to the tune of \$1.7 million. The contract to build these essential items was awarded to the Griffith Company of Los Angeles.

Griffith was a prominent contractor at the time (with contractor's license number #88, which they still use in their business!), and they were involved in some high-visibility projects which shaped the southern California we live in today. In particular, they provided street work in many communities of the time, including Los Angeles, San Pedro, Long Beach and Bakersfield. If the communities couldn't repay the bonds for the work done by Griffith, Griffith would acquire land in lieu of payment. As might be imagined, Griffith became a significant landowner in southern California.

But in the case of our own island, contemporary news accounts emphasize that the Griffith Company "purchased" 750 lots on a financially stressed Lido Isle in 1933. The president of the Griffith Company built a home for himself at the end of Lido at 939 Via Lido Soud (sold in the 1950s to Pacific Mutual Insurance Company president, Asa Call).

Another longtime Griffith executive, John Anton Holmstrom, was also given a prime lot at the end of Lido. Holmstrom eventually sold his lot to pay for his

son's Stanford tuition, but Holmstrom's granddaughter still carries on the family legacy as a prominent Lido Isle resident. And she is...the lovely Lexi Graveline! Lexi provided Old Isle with a copy of a 1930 article from the Long Beach Sun newspaper, which quotes her grandfather regarding development in the Newport Harbor area: "...making a fine harbor of Newport is not new. As early as 1875 pioneers from further inland in the state used Newport as their harbor for carrying on trade with San Francisco." The article also separately and cryptically notes that "plans are being drawn up for the construction of a modern airport on the mainland, opposite Lido Isle." What a dramatic landing that would be! Thanks so much to Lexi for providing these interesting insights into early Lido history.


Summer Sailing Recap




Courts are first-come/first-serve but must be relinquished immediately to a resident who has made a reservation. Recreation courts are for residents and their guests only.


